FAST MAIL OFF FIVE YEARS AGO THE RAILS

ONE WHEEL CRUMBLES AND ALL TRAINS STALLED.

Late No. 9 Comes to Slight Grief at Huron Early Today.

Passenger and mail trains were stalled near Huron early this morning and relief was not accorded the blockade until well along in the forenoon. A wheel on a car of No. 9, the fast westbound mail train due here last night, crumbled near Huron and though the train was run along a distance of about 15 telephone poles before coming to a halt, no damage was done to speak of. The trouble with the wheel was one of those unusual instances where the rim and flange become separated from the wheel proper by excess heat caused probably by the brakeshoe. The board of inquiry has not made its report yet but that is presumed to be the cause.

The wrecker was sent out from here and was at work early this morning for No. 9 last night did not arrive until after midnight and it was 3 o'clock before the accident happened. None were injured.

No. 10, the mail train from Portland this morning and No. 6 were both stalled on the west side of the trouble and did not arrive here until nearly 11 o'clock.

STUPENDOUS ADVANCES IN ITS BUILDING LINES SEEN.

Indomitable Spirit Shown in Preparation for Panama Fair.

San Francisco, April 18.—Five years ago today the newspapers of the world were informing their shocked and horrified readers that San Francisco was utterly destroyed, annihilated, wiped off the map. What the earthquake had commenced, the terrible conflagration that swept over the city threatened to finish, and to the onlookers it seemed that nothing was to be left of the doomed city but a collection of first class ruins.

Within the brief space of five years, San Francisco has fully demonstrated that the Phoenix, the fabled bird that was burned and arose from its ashes, had nothing on this city. Ambitious rival municipalities along the Pacific coast, which had reckoned San Francisco as in the Babylon and Nineveh class, reckoned without the indomitable spirit that has rebuilt a bigger and better Frisco on the ruins that were considered, after the fire, as being fit only for the habitation of hoot-owls.

Today the people of the Golden Gate city are celebrating the anniversary by preparing for the biggest international exposition in the world's history. Moreover, the recently stricken city is not asking for the assistance of Uncle Sam. The business men of the city subscribed \$7,500,000 before it had been decided where the Panama exposition was to be held, and now that the fair is an assured fact there will be no lack of funds to carry the project to a glorious completion. San Francisco is anxious to show the world how she has come up out of the ashes of her destructive fire, and the commercial interests are willing to pay big for the privilege.

While many of the "shacks" and cheap frame temporary buildings that were put up after the fire have not yet been replaced, it is expected that all of them will have been torn down by the time the exposition opens in 1915. The work of rebuilding is now somewhat retarded by a scarcity of labor, but as rapidly as the contractors can handle the jobs the "shacks" are giving way to handsome structures of steel, brick and stone. In the business district proper class A buildings—that is, of fireproof steel and stone construction—predominate. Insurance experts believe that a repetition of the disastrous fire of five years ago now would be almost impossible.

In the heart of the city, real estate values are higher than before the fire, and every day adds to the value of the property. Those who despaired of the future of the city and sold their holdings for a song aided in the enrichment of many men of faith and good judgment who have become wealthy through their investments.
