## WOMEN ARE VERY INDIGNANT

TEAMSTERS CRUEL TO HORSES, IS  
THE CLAIM.

May Be a Humane Society Organized  
to Punish Brutality.

A number of La Grande ladies have expressed their indignation today at some teamsters who are at work on street and public works in La Grande. So strong is the feeling that the acts of beating horses the past few days may not go by unnoticed and the offenders have a chance to be drawn before the courts for the past acts, to say nothing of what will happen in the future if they continue their alleged cruelty toward horses which they are working.

One lady was vehement in her denunciation of a certain driver on Adams avenue who was working a small team to a heavy load of rock and because the team could not pull the load he lashed the horses until they quivered and could hardly stand.

"In this city of ours," she said, "it is a burning disgrace and outrage that such cruelties should be permitted. There may be no humane society but there are courts and we can easily organize a society if it be necessary. I have seen a number of the ladies and this sort of thing is not going to be permitted without a protest. Why a man can be so degraded as to mistreat a horse that is doing more work than it seemingly can stand is more than I know. Surely such a man needs some disciplining along the lines of decency. Yes, you can say in the Observer that the fight is on unless this cruelty is stopped and it is a question if some punishment shall not be meted for the acts already committed."

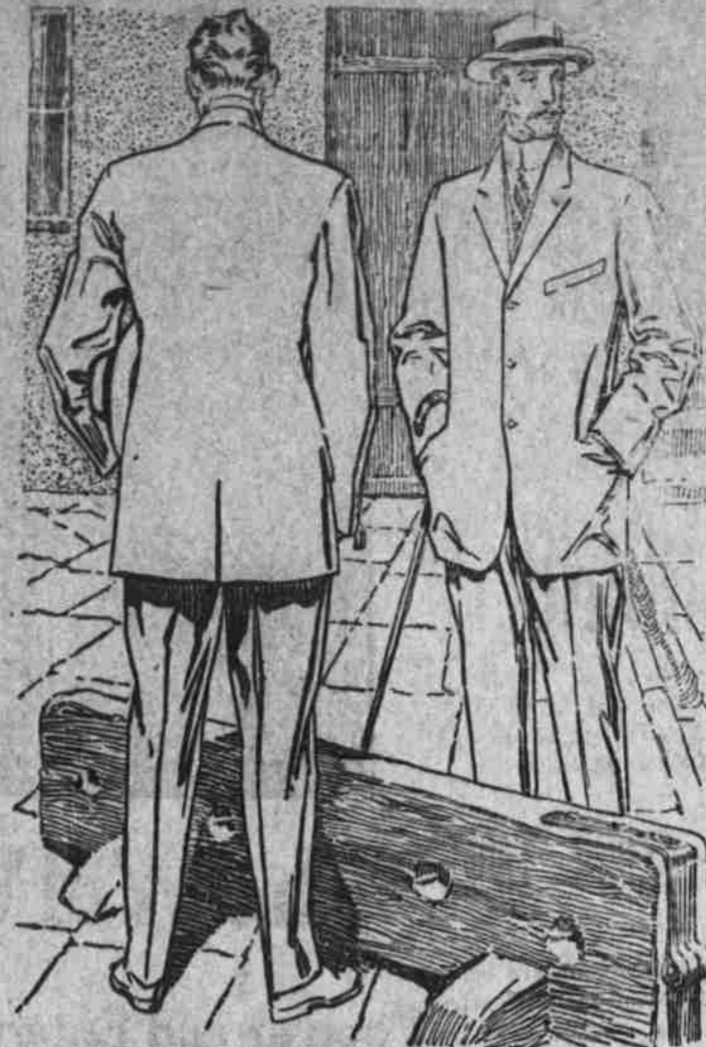
### Notice of Street Improvement.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:  
Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 5th day of June, 1910, creating Sewer Improvement District No. 1 and designating boundaries of Sewer District No. 1, as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 12th day of April, 1911, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of said district, in said sewer improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying sewers in the streets and alleys, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefitted by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

(A) And the property affected or benefitted by said improvement is as follows:

Commencing at the junction of Willow street and the O.-W. R. & N. Co.'s railway track, thence northwest to block "A", Honan's addition, thence southwest 250 feet, thence west down center of Jefferson avenue to the center of Fourth street and Jefferson avenue, thence north on Fourth street to center of Division street, thence west on Division street to city limits, thence south to center of Baker street, thence east on Baker street and "Z" avenue to a point directly north of the center line (north and south) of block 15, Gangloff's addition, thence south to center of "N" avenue, thence east on "N" avenue to a point directly south of the center line (north and south) of block 2, Wisdom's addition to La Grande, thence north in alley between Cedar street and Oak street to center of "O" avenue, thence east on "O" avenue to Cedar street, thence north on Cedar street to Pennsylvania avenue, thence east on Pennsylvania avenue to a point opposite the center line (north and south) of block 11, Grandy's addition to the city of La Grande, thence north in alley between Second street and Third street to Main avenue, thence east on Main avenue to a point south of center (north and south) of block 1, Grandy's addition to the city of La Grande, thence north in alley between Third and Fourth streets to Adams avenue, thence southeast down Adams avenue to Willow street, thence east on Willow street to the place of beginning.

Notice is hereby further given that the council will levy a special assessment on all the property affected and
