BEETLE WAR AT SUMPTER

BIG CREW HUNTING BUGS OF THE SUMPTER FORESTS.

Entomology Department of Government Has Crew at Work.

Forest Supervisor Henry Ireland has one fully established camp of "bug hunters" working about eight miles from Sumpter on Deer creek, relates the Baker Democrat. There are from 15 to 20 men in the camp, and other camps will be established as soon as weather conditions will permit. The men in these camps work under the direction of the bureau of entomology, and their purpose is to destroy the pine beetle or at least control the work of the insect that is threatening destruction to large areas of the forests of Eastern Oregon.

The forest service has been allotted not to exceed \$25,000 for the campaign against the beetles on the national forests in this part of the state. The general land office has expressed a willingness and a desire to take action wherever it is specifically advised on the public domain, and the Oregon state land board has expressed a like desire to take action within its means and power to undertake advised work on state lands.

An organization of private owners of timber lands in Baker and Grant counties has a fund of \$3,000 to \$5,000 available and expects to secure considerable more for co-operative work in controlling the insects. Many independent owners have expressed their willingness to do their share of the work required on their lands and to co-operate in the required disposal of infestation on adjacent land. The government will have three and part of the time four, of its agents and experts in the field to assist through advice and instructions in carrying out details in the recommended methods of the control work.

It is believed in addition to the facts determined as to the character and extent of the depredations, that the acquired practical training and information on certain features of the problem, as a result of the instructions and demonstrations will enable the federal officials and private owners to accomplish more this spring for each dollar expended than could have been done last year at many times greater expense.
