BOOSTERS VISIT ELGIN FOLKS

FIRST MOVE TO FORM AN EXTENSIVE ASSOCIATION.

Local Club Directors Go to Elgin This Evening.

Firing the first gun in a campaign to place the commercial clubs of Union and Wallawa counties on a firmly cemented foundation, wherein each and all are to work not only harmoniously but unitedly for a common end a group of Commercial club directors are planning on leaving early this evening by automobile for Elgin where the first of a series of calls will be made. The proposition is for the directors to talk over the commercial situation with the Elgin directors and commence the scheme which is intended to work for the common good of all. The plan has been advanced often, but this is the first time that steps have actually been taken to carry into realization the idea which is the most plausible one for all concerned. The cost of publicity is not only relieved from one particular club. It is argued, but the benefits derived will be scattered to the towns of both the Grande Ronde and Wallawa valleys.

Those who are scheduled to make the trip this evening are: Commercial Club Manager S. M. Slough, Directors Currey, Geddes, Dunn, Collier, Wood, Holmes and Dennis.

Stallion Law Effective May 25.
Corvallis, April 20.—(Special)—The new stallion law which was passed by the last session of the legislature will go into effect May 25. The stallion board has been organized, and plans for the work are being made, but no licenses will be issued until after May 25. Stallion owners should, however, get in their applications before that date.

It will not be possible to register and have examined all the horses in the state in a day or two, so that some time may intervene between the receipt of the application and the issuance of the license. It is not expected that the owners stop using their horses during that period, but it is expected that no horses will be used after May 25th until an application for license has been made.

Animals having county licenses will also have to get state licenses under the new law, as there is no connection between the state license and that issued by the county. Money paid for county licenses will not count toward securing state licenses. Copies of the law and application blanks may be obtained from the secretary of the board at Corvallis. It is not necessary, however, that the applications be made on the regular blanks. A letter will do as well providing the necessary information is included. All applications must be accompanied by the \$10 fee, and, in case of registered horses, by the pedigree certificate. These pedigrees will be returned. For horses not pure-bred the owner must give a complete statement of the horse's breeding. E. L. Potter, secretary Stallion Registration board.

Opening Yakima Division.

On Friday, March 24th, the O-W. R. & N. will open its new branch from Attalla to North Yakima, and will run a through train daily between Walla Walla and North Yakima, leaving Walla Walla at 9:15, arriving at North Yakima at 3:09 p. m.

Returning train will leave North Yakima at 8:45 a. m., arriving in Walla Walla at 2:30 p. m.

In addition to the above service motor cars will be run between Kennewick and North Yakima, and between Grand View and North Yakima, also between Midvale and Sunnyside. Connections westbound can be made with Washington Division No. 8 and main line No. 5; eastbound at Walla Walla with Washington division No. 7 and main line No. 18.

Notice of Street Improvement.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:
Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 5th day of June, 1910, creating Sewer Improvement District No. 1 and designating boundaries of Sewer District No. 1, as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 12th day of April, 1911, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of said district, in said sewer improvement district as herein-after described, by laying sewers in the streets and alleys, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

(A) And the property affected or benefited by said improvement is as follows:

Commencing at the junction of Willow street and the O-W. R. & N. Co.'s railway track, thence northwest to block "A", Honan's addition, thence southwest 250 feet, thence west down center of Jefferson avenue to the center of Fourth street and Jefferson avenue, thence north on Fourth street to center of Division street, thence west on Division street to city limits, thence south to center of Baker street, thence east on Baker street and "Z" avenue to a point directly north of the center line (north and south) of block 15, Gangloff's addition, thence south to center of "N" avenue, thence east on "N" avenue to a point directly south of the center line (north and south) of block 2, Wisdom's addition to La Grande, thence north in alley between Cedar street and Oak street to center of "O" avenue, thence east on "O" avenue to Cedar street, thence north on Cedar street to Pennsylvania avenue, thence east on Pennsylvania avenue to a point opposite the center line (north and south) of block 11, Grandy's addition to the city of La Grande, thence north in alley between Second street and Third street to Main avenue, thence east on Main avenue to a point south of center (north and south) of block 1, Grandy's addition to the city of La Grande, thence north in alley between

Third and Fourth streets to Adams avenue, thence southeast down Adams avenue to Willow street, thence east on Willow street to the place of beginning.

Notice is hereby further given that the council will levy a special assessment on all the property affected and benefited by such improvement for the purpose of paying for such improvement. That the estimated cost of such improvement is the sum of \$71,800.08. That the council will on the 26th day of April, 1911, meet at the council chamber at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m., to consider said estimated cost, and the levy of said assessment, when a hearing will be granted to any person feeling aggrieved by such assessment.
