**FRANK SCOTT IS
LAID AWAY**

**REMAINS INTERRED YESTERDAY
BY SORROWING FRIENDS.**

Masonic Order and Eastern Star Attended Body at Grave.

Last tribute to the life of a popular young man, Frank Scott who died last week, was paid yesterday afternoon by sorrowing friends and relatives and mourning lodges and women. The remains of the late Mr. Scott were interred under impressive circumstances. The Masonic order and the order of Eastern Star added their funeral ritual to the services conducted at the residence of the deceased mother. The two orders marched from the lodge home to the residence where Rev. W. S. Seemann officiated. At the cemetery the Masonic and Eastern Star ritual burial services were conducted. The pallbearers, fellow Masons, were: Avery Harrison, Hugh McCall, Fred Huffman, Clinton Van Fleet, George Pfeiffer and Ralph Reynolds. Beautiful floral tributes banked the casket at the home and again at the grave, speaking of the high esteem which the young man held in his home city.

To Be Tried for Alleged Cotton Frauds
Huntsville, Ala., April 24.—It is expected that the trial of John W. Knight will be reached in the United States circuit court here this week. The case, popularly known as the "cotton frauds" case, has attracted national attention. Mr. Knight was the managing partner of the cotton firm of Knight and Yancy, which failed about a year ago with indebtedness amounting to over \$5,000,000. Soon after the collapse of the firm Mr. Knight was indicted on a charge of fraudulent use of the United States mails.

Prohibition Oratorical Contest.
Stillwater, Okla., April 24.—The annual meeting of the Oklahoma Inter-collegiate Prohibition league began here today and will conclude tomorrow night with the annual oratorical contest. The institutions represented at the gathering include the university of Oklahoma, the state agricultural and mechanical college, the Oklahoma Christian university, Kendall college and the Oklahoma Baptist college.

(A) And the property affected or benefitted by said improvement is as follows:
Commencing at the junction of Willow street and the O. W. R. & N. Co.'s railway track, thence northwest to block "A", Honan's addition, thence southwest 250 feet, thence west down center of Jefferson avenue to the center of Fourth street and Jefferson avenue, thence north on Fourth street to center of Division street, thence west on Division street to city limits, thence south to center of Baker street, thence east on Baker street and "Z" avenue to a point directly north of the center line (north and south) of block 15, Gangloff's addition, thence south to center of "N" avenue, thence east on "N" avenue to a point directly south of the center line (north and south) of block 2, Wisdom's addition to La Grande, thence north in alley between Cedar street and Oak street to center of "O" avenue, thence east on "O" avenue to Cedar street, thence north on Cedar street to Pennsylvania avenue, thence east on Pennsylvania avenue to a point opposite the center line (north and south) of block 11, Grandy's addition to the city of La Grande, thence north in alley between Second street and Third street to Main avenue, thence east on Main avenue to a point south of center (north and south) of block 1, Grandy's addition to the city of La Grande, thence north in alley between Third and Fourth streets to Adams avenue, thence southeast down Adams avenue to Willow street, thence east on Willow street to the place of beginning.
