**PASSION PLAY TOMORROW.**

**Oberammergau Production Is Coming Here for Two Days—at Arcade**

Oberammergau and its "Passion Play," which will be shown at the Arcade tomorrow, is perennially fascinating the attention of the world. Every ten years when the religious drama is re-enacted by the Bavarian peasants increasing multitudes flock to see it. Some of them go because they are anxious to see a performance which is praised by the whole world. Others fall naturally in the current of fashion. Others obtain deep religious satisfaction from the spectacle of the persecution and suffering of the great Savior. The Passion Play is then a sacred ceremony and they attend it with the same feeling of devotion as the villagers who perform its various parts. The Passion Play as it exists in our times has been pruned of all its mediæval license and its text has been cast into literary form. The costumes are still designed and made by the peasants. All parts are taken by natives of Oberammergau and often the same part is played by the same man decade after decade until he acquires world-wide fame. This was the case with Josef Mayr, who played the character of Jesus in 1870, 1880, and 1890. This celebrated Oberammergau died in 1903 at a good old age revered by multitudes who had witnessed his artistic and reverent portrayal of the most difficult part in all drama. Many other Oberammergau actors have justly earned wide reputations, but for a wonder they seem to retain their village humility and the love of money has not apparently inspired the deep sincerity of their art. Live is not a festival for them and nobody could blame them much if they should sometime make up their minds to improve the opportunity to become suddenly rich which every ten year period affords them. In its modern form the Passion Play began as an act of devotion and such it has continued for centuries. Today it is one of the wonders of the world for beauty and religious devotion.
