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ROSE WEEK FULL SIXTH OF EVENTS FOR LEVELLED PAVING

EDUCATIONAL NOTE TO BE MANIFEST THROUGH PARADES.

Announcement of Completed Program Is Made.

The official program for the fifth annual Rose Festival to be held the week of June 5-10, has been completed in detail. It contains an array of attractions far more elaborate than has ever been attempted in similar civic fetes or celebrations in this part of the country. The week is to be replete with events educational in character; it will have spectacular parades and pageants of the most entertaining sort. There will be matinee harness races and a fine hunt club meet, with a carnival of aquatic events on the river.

The school children will parade, the young women and girls of the Peninsula will give their annual "Show of Roses" through the business streets. All the fraternal, military and labor organizations are to have a night of parades and carnival of fun of their own.

Sunday, the day before the formal opening of the celebration, will be honored as "Rose Sunday," a custom inaugurated two years ago.

The opening day is set down as "Home-Coming Day," and for general decoration, illumination and preparation for the revels that are to follow. Special exercises will attend the arrival of Rex Orgonus, the merry old monarch who will hold sway during the week of festivities.

The theatres are scheduled to play attractions of unusual interest, and numerous social functions headed by the grand military and civilian ball at the armory are planned for the week.

The annual competitive exhibition of roses under the auspices of the Portland Rose society will occupy two days of the program, Tuesday and Wednesday.

Ceremonies and exercises appropriate to the occasion.

Greetings and imposing welcome to the rose, Queen of flowers.

Special sermons in many pulpits, glorifying the return of the fragrant and beautiful rose.

Monday, June 5.

Home-coming day. Hearty welcome to all visitors.

High noon—Arrival of Rex Orgonus upriver on royal barge conveyed by a fleet of loyal mariners.

Grand review—Water pageant, consisting of gaily decorated boats and water crafts of every variety.

8:00 p. m.—Special program at the Oaks park and on the Willamette river, general illumination, feast of lanterns.

Tuesday, June 6.

10:00 a. m.—Musical symposium and street serenades by Rose City bands on most elaborately decorated thoroughfares.

2:00 p. m.—Formal opening of the competitive rose exhibit at the armory, under the auspices of the Portland Rose society.

8:30 p. m.—Grand electric parade,

NO FURTHER ACTION HAS BEEN TAKEN ON SUIT.

While Matter Is Pending in Court, Construction Goes on.

Notwithstanding that suit has been brought in circuit court to forestall bitulithic pavement of Sixth street, grading and filling was commenced today at the north end of the thoroughfare by the Warren Construction company. The suit filed by Attorney J. D. Slater last Saturday at the instigation of F. D. Halsten is still awaiting answer from the city and no action on the matter of restraining orders has yet been taken as a consequence.

1:00 p. m. Special matinee given by the Riverside Driving club at the Country club grounds.

5:00 p. m.—Grande parade of human rosebuds. East Portland, 5000 school children participating.

9:00 p. m.—Crowning social feature of the festival, grand military ball at the armory, given under the auspices of the Oregon National guard.

Saturday, June 10.

10:00 a. m.—Marching bands serenading the elaborately decorated streets and business houses.

2:00 p. m.—Special racing matinee at the Country club, given under the auspices of the Portland Hunt club.

8:30 p. m.—Most grand and imposing electric parade in honor of Rex Orgonus, who will depart with Spirit da Carnival, in a blaze of glory.
