All that portion of Elm street, from the north line of Washington avenue, to the south curb line of Jefferson avenue.

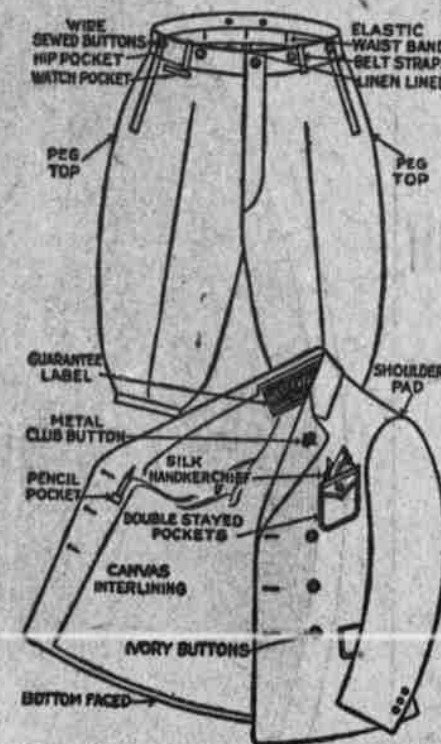

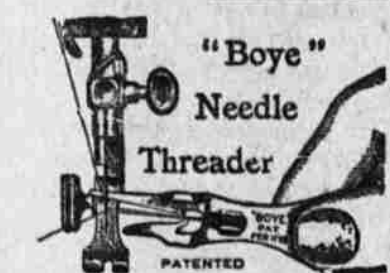
