LIQUOR LAW IS OPERATIVE

PORTLAND INTRODUCES STRINGENT SALOON LAWS.

Oregon Home Rule Issues Statement in Connection With New Law.

The new and stringent saloon laws in Portland are now in effect.

Penalties for violation of the law are now much more severe and are definitely fixed, so that it is mandatory upon the courts to impose at least the minimum punishment. For a first offense, the penalty is not less than \$100 nor more than \$250 fine, or imprisonment of not less than 50 days nor more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court. For a second violation the penalty is a fine of not less than \$250 nor more than \$500, or imprisonment not less than 50 days nor more than six months, or both, in the discretion of the court.

Third Offense Revokes License.

A third offense absolutely revokes the license and in addition imposes a fine of \$500, or imprisonment of not less than six months, or both, in the discretion of the court, but the court has no discretion in the matter of the license, which must be revoked. A special provision makes a second conviction for violating the Sunday closing law also forfeit the license of the offender.

In connection with this fact, the following statement from the Greater Oregon Home Rule association is made:

In many cities throughout the state, and in Portland also, there is now under way a general and widespread movement looking toward better regulation of the liquor traffic. In this movement all the people of the state are interested, not only because of the recent election on state-wide prohibition, local option by counties, and the home rule bill, but particularly because the ensuing year will undoubtedly determine for a long time to come the status of that business in Oregon.

Liquor Business on Trial.

The liquor business is on trial. The old-time frontier combination dance hall, saloon and gambling joint has long since gone to return no more. Conditions today are infinitely better than they were. But there is still much room for improvement, and that improvement is coming.

When the people of Oregon last November by an overwhelming majority voted down state-wide prohibition and under the local option law voted 12 "dry" counties "wet," and in addition to all this enacted into constitutional law the home rule bill, giving cities the right to choose license or no license, regardless of the county vote, they did so in the firm conviction that the liquor traffic could and would be better regulated.

The form that this regulation shall take is a matter upon which many disagree. Several cities have enacted drastic ordinances, others have increased the license fee or limited the number of saloons, and still others have done all these things in an attempt better to regulate the business.

At the outset, it is best to recognize frankly the fact that all the responsibility does not rest upon those directly engaged in the liquor business, and if progress is to be made, the people at large and the various municipal authorities must co-operate in the work. A saloon does not determine the character of the people who live near it or patronize it. It is the people who live near it and who patronize it to make the saloon what it is.

Power Rests With Council.

The sole power to license rests with the city council. They have the exclusive right to refuse or grant a license, and councilmen are bound by their oath of office to investigate the moral character of every applicant. They, more than any other power, can assist in regulating the liquor business by determining to whom licenses shall be granted. In them is also vested the right to determine the number of licenses which shall be issued in their city, except where there is a charter provision limiting that number. It is too often the case that city councils in order to obtain large revenue from this source, grant more licenses than are necessary or proper. The result is inevitable. The liquor dealer is driven
