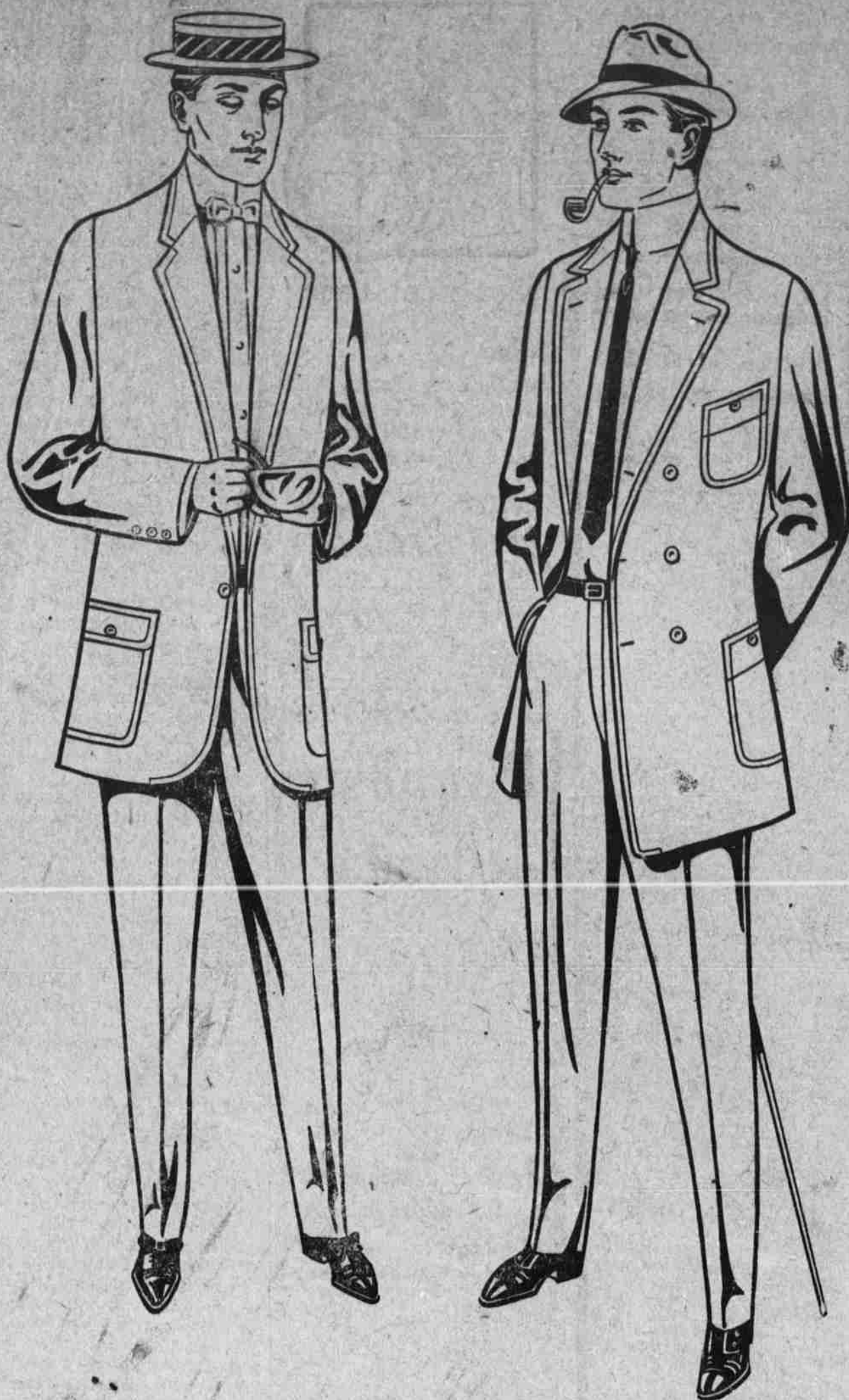

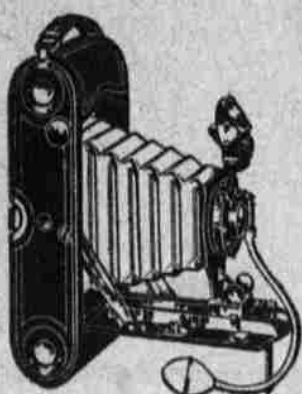

WILL ACT AS PRESIDENT-MANAGER OF LOCAL CLUB.

New Stimulus Given Present Pennant Chasers—Maintain Sound Basis.

Added business stability and prestige was lent to the La Grande Baseball club last night when, at a meeting of the present members of the team, more assistance was given to the management of the club's affairs, financial and routine, by the election of Will Y. Stoddard, manager of the Grande Ronde Lumber company's mill and holdings at Perry. Mr. Stoddard assumes the presidency of the local club, looking after the financial affairs and with A. W. Nelson, secretary of the local club, will have entire supervision of the procurement of players and the settlement of all accounts against the club. James Bradley will handle the men on the field, using such men as are given to him by the management. With an aggregation of players that have shown unusual ability at this early time of the season, the team has commanded the attention of the entire league territory and while the team will be run as economically as is consistent, the team will include one or two salaried men, or more, and without becoming burdensome to any of the fans, though dependent on some assistance, the team will be kept in such shape that the pennant will not only be won if possible but there will be a continuous presentation of good clean baseball.

Mr. Stoddard displays much interest in the ventures and will lend a great deal of time and attention to the per-

fection of the club's finances so that the team can continue to meet its obligations as it started out to do.

It is possible that there will be changes in the lineup. This feature is dependent entirely on how much support the fans give the team in donations and if there is only \$500 subscribed monthly, salaries men to that amount will be employed; if the fans subscribe \$2000 a month, that amount will be hired, and so on. Egan, for instance, has doubled that amount, Baker trebled it, and Union doubled it. On the strength of what the other towns have done, La Grande will be called on for at least half of what each of the other towns are giving, and apparently not setting together a team that is a match to La Grande's, either.
