**OPINION WRONG
ON NEW LAW**

**OLD COUNTY CERTIFICATES NOT
EXEMPTIONS HEREAFTER.**

Attorney General Disputes Opinion of State Superintendent.

Opinions of the head of the educational department of the state and that of the public in general as well, regarding the new state examination laws, have been in error according to a decision of the attorney general. It has been generally understood that the state board of examiners could take cognizance of the county certificates under the old law and what exemptions they might have obtained would allow them to avoid an examination under the new law.

On request of Superintendent Alderman of Baker county, the attorney general denies this, saying:

"Replying to your communication of the 28th ultimo, asking whether the provisions of Chapter 58, Session Laws of 1911, an applicant who has secured part of her exemptions, or all of her exemptions, exceeding two subjects, and have since secured a standing of more than 85 in these two subjects, will be permitted to take another examination at the June state examinations on the residue to have a certificate which maintains subjects, and thus secure is renewable every three years. I beg to say, in my opinion, the law does not have such effect. It might have, and in my opinion would, if the old exemptions had not been expressly repealed, but section 31 of said chapter 58 of the laws of 1911, expressly repeals section 34 of the school laws of 1909, page 27, the same being section 11 of chapter 116 laws of 1907, and relates to exemptions, and nearly all of the other sections of the said chapter 116 are also expressly repealed.

"Therefore, all exemptions heretofore granted, where the party has not received a first grade certificate thereunder, have been wiped out and an applicant will have to commence examinations anew."

BAKER DOCTOR DEAD.

Physician Recently Returning from Iowa Passes Away.

Dr. W. A. Trueblood was called by death this week after being ill for only ten days with pneumonia. He made a hard struggle but the fight was more than he could win and death was the victor, says the Baker Herald.

Dr. Trueblood has resided in Baker only 13 months, coming here last year from Oskaloosa, Iowa, where he had been engaged in the practice of medicine. He was a good physician and was building up an excellent practice. He was well liked as a man and a doctor and his many friends will be grieved at his death.

He is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Trueblood, his wife, a sister, Miss Marie Trueblood, and a brother in the east. He was 38 years old.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 9th day of February, 1910, creating Improvement District No. 20, and designating Elm street as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 19th day of April, 1911, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Elm street, in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon bitulithic pavement, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefitted by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 5th day of August, 1909, creating Improvement District No. 4, and designating Washington avenue as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 12th day of April, 1911, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Washington avenue in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon bitu-

lithic pavement, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefitted by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:
