TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 18th day of August, 1909, creating improvement district No. 7, and designating Monroe avenue as such district and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 12th day of April, 1911, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Monroe avenue in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by building cement walks 5 feet wide, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefitted by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

All that portion of Monroe avenue, from the east line of North Fir street, to the west line of North Spruce street.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 5th day of August, 1909, creating improvement district No. 4, and designating Washington avenue as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 12th day of April, 1911, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Washington avenue in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon bituminous pavement, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefitted by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

All that portion of Washington avenue from the east curb line of First street, to the east line of Fir street.

The field was very slow, following a heavy rain the night before and the slow time does not reflect the effort put forth by the athletes. The events follow:
