**FARM ON WHEELS
 IS SEEN**

Corvallis, Or., May 12.—(Special.)
 This week the visitors from the
 State Grangers' convention were given
 an opportunity to see exactly what
 a "moving school of agriculture" is
 like, and what the program might
 easily be made to contain of practical
 information of vital importance to the
 farmer. Such a school, on a small
 scale, with a suggestive program was
 on exhibition in the main agricultural
 hall, and members of the faculty were
 present to explain the exhibits and
 apparatus.

As an outgrowth of the farmers'
 urgent demand for a more extensive
 educational system for the farmer
 than is offered by the usual institute,
 this movable school is suggested by
 the agricultural college as a solution
 of the problem, so that practically
 at their homes, all who are interested
 may have the advantage of moderate-
 ly equipped laboratories for technical
 study and practical work in problems
 relating to the farm and home.

The college proposes to conduct
 these schools at least three days at
 a time at each place, with three or
 more departments of instruction rep-
 resented. Owing to a lack of funds
 for extension work, but few of them
 can be undertaken at the present time
 but if, in years to come, the legisla-
 ture will see its way in granting the
 appropriation asked for extension this
 year, the farmers and housewives of
 the state may have a chance to study
 the applied science of their profes-
 sion.

The one-week program suggested
 by the domestic science department
 for the movable schools, includes prac-
 tical sewing work, bread making, veg-
 etables and meats, invalid diet, home
 nursing, sanitation, salad mixing, dec-
 orating the home, and the making of
 desserts and candies.

The department of agriculture, in
 a three-day program, will give lec-
 tures on the location of orchards,
 grafting and budding, pruning, spray-
 ing, handling the crop, and apple pack-
 ing, with demonstration work.

Feeds for dairy cattle, the impor-
 tance of keeping feed and milk records,
 the Babcock test, separator use, the
 care of milk and cream, and butter
 making are to be taught by the dairy
 department. The agronomy depart-
 ment has prepared an interesting and
 instructive exhibit showing the grave
 necessity of testing seed for vitality
 and cleanness from weeds. An al-
 falfa plant being smothered by dod-
 der is shown growing, to illustrate
 the process by which the parasite
 kills the alfalfa.

The poultry department also pre-
 pared a program of special instruc-
 tion for those desirous of learning
 how to get big yields of eggs from
 their flocks and big market returns.

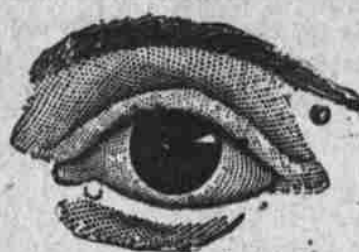
