Umatilla Brakeman Hurt.

Thrown suddenly from a precarious footing on a pile of lumber loaded aboard two gondola cars on a moving freight train at Umatilla, T. B. Nixon, a well known O-W. R. & N. brakeman, narrowly escaped death and sustained injuries which threatened him for a time the loss of a foot, says the Pendleton Live Wire.

The injured railroad man was picked up by companions and brought to Pendleton on train No. 18 Wednesday evening. He was removed at once to the hospital where Dr. Ringo attended him. It is now believed that the foot can be saved, although it was necessary to amputate two toes. His lower limb was badly crushed.

Nixon will be taken to Portland on Train No. 5 this evening. He bore up with remarkable fortitude despite the extreme pain of his injury.
