WASHINGTON TO BE PAVED

SEWER CONTRACT IS LET AND MANY OTHER THINGS DONE.

Majority Side on Washington in Favor of the Paving Element.

Acceptance of the G. H. Sutherland bid of some \$42,000 for the construction of approximately 7 1-2 miles of sewer in this city, hearing of important committee reports and deciding to pave Washington avenue from First to Fir regardless of the minority protests, were only a few of the important transactions occurring at the council session last evening when Mayor Richardson and all the councilmen, Davis, Orvis, Church, Mackey, Dunn, Fleming, Finley and Logsdon, were present.

Reports of committees were heard with considerable interest. The street committee reported that of the total of 315 feet of frontage on Washington avenue proposed to be paved, 1388 remonstrated, leaving a total of 375 majority for the paving. Bids were ordered advertised for when the council decided to do the paving and the bids will be opened July 24.

The special committee sent to Portland to investigate fire apparatus made its report and the report was referred back to the fire and police committee. The text of the special report, signed by Councilman Mackey and Orvis is that the Long proposition be adopted; that the \$5,800 combination chemical and hose automobile be sent here for a 30 days' trial under the direction of a skilled machinist and that the city give the apparatus a thorough tryout and if not found satisfactory that the machine be returned. The report seemed to meet with popular favor and unless the machine is found to be wanting of its promises, La Grande will in all probability have such a truck soon. Final action will be taken next Wednesday evening.

The water, health and sewer com-

mittee reported that it had taken the first bid of the lot presented last Wednesday evening and the report was adopted.

This is the contract that involves about seven and a half miles of sewer. That minor bills cannot slip through the exchequer without proper scrutiny became evidence last evening when the various committees reported on bills. Of the entire batch only a few were held up pending further investigation. It was found that O. K.'s had been neglected in some instances but after prying here and there and careful study of the nature of the bills all were finally allowed in some form or other.

The city auditor reported the books of the city to be in O. K. shape. He found minor errors in some instances but they had been corrected. The Dan Marx property on Elm street will have to install a 12-foot sidewalk at once, according to the report of the commission appointed for that purpose.

Minor errors have crept into the notices to property owners on Fir street relative to the proposed macadam on that street and the day of remonstrances has been postponed until June 7. In the meantime the property owners will be re-advised of the work.

Property owners between M and N west of Fourth petitioned that a sewer be laid temporarily in the gulch and to connect with the sewer east of Fourth. This was referred.

A petition for a board sidewalk on W. avenue from North Greenwood to Y and to the city limits was read and referred.

A remonstrance against the macadam on North Greenwood from the railroad track to T avenue was read. The chief reason is that the tax payers were misinformed about the distance. They want connections with the hard surface at Adams or not at all. This was also referred.

Applications for liquor licenses, accompanied by \$625, the balance due for the year, were read and accepted. These are J. E. Foley, Chris Wright, J. F. O'Connell, Herman Roesch, Ulrich Lottes, George Good, Julius Fisher and G. A. Lincoln.
