SPOKANE FIGHT WARM ONE

WOMEN ARE AFTER THE SCHOOL BOARD POSITIONS.

Woman's Non-Partizan League Enters Active Politics Again.

Spokane, Wash., May 19.—(Special)—Mrs. A. P. Fassett, president of the Woman's Non-Partizan Political League, flung the gauntlet into the arena today when she announced that two of its members will be candidates for the school board of Spokane at the election on December 2, to succeed J. Grier Long, president of the Washington Trust company, and A. U. Davis, an officer of the Spokane Bar association, whose terms end next fall. Members of the league declare they have numerous grievances and that so far the school board has shown little or no consideration for their recommendations. Mrs. M. E. Black, who is head of the insurgent wing of the league, probably will be a candidate; but it is given out that no formal announcement will be made until the movement is organized among the women electors and two candidates are agreed upon. "While we are working on the theory that 'the early bird catches the worm,'" said Mrs. Fassett, "it is also purposed to show the officers of the school board that our members are not in a mood to compromise."

YAKIMA CLAIMS BIG CROPS

TWO THOUSAND CARS ESTIMATED FOR THIS YEAR.

Growers and Inspectors Agree on That Number as the Output.

Spokane, Wash., May 19.—(Special)—Two thousand cars of apples will be harvested in the Yakima valley this season, according to a statement received today by the Spokane chamber of commerce from H. P. James, secretary of the Yakima Commercial club, who compiled the figures from reports by growers and inspectors. The pear crop will be normal throughout the valley, Mr. James adds and other fruit, including peaches, will bring the total production to approximately 3,000 cars. Some losses were occasioned by late frosts, but in spite of this the crops gives promise of being larger than the average. Growers in other parts of eastern and central Washington and Idaho, eastern Oregon and western Montana also report that every prospect is bright for large crops of apples and other tree fruits. Bankers in Spokane and throughout the district estimate that the wheat yield of the Inland Empire will be "fully 66,000,000 bushels this season. Winter wheat was amply protected and the spring-sown grain is doing well in all parts of the country because of the timely general rains."

"Vote Bill" Is Back Again.

"Vote Bill" Leland, who twelve years ago was the star tackle of the Heppner football team which defeated gridiron aggregation in this part of the county and which even took Multnomah scalp by a 12 to 0 score, reached Pendleton today on his trip from Wyoming to Montana. "Vote Bill" has many friends here who are glad to look upon him again.—Pendleton East Oregonian.
