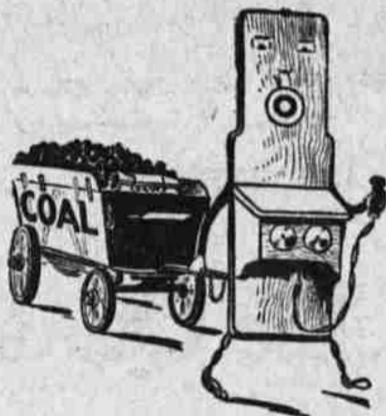

LOCALS SCORED 6 POINTS

TOTAL BRINGS LA GRANDE UP TOWARD THE FRONT.

Millering Establishes New Record for Corvallis Interscholastic.

With a total of six points to their credit, bringing them well up to the front of the winnings of the 28 schools entered, La Grande did better at the All-State meet at Corvallis than was expected. In the stiff competition, points are like hen's teeth. Aside from winning first place, Jay Millering established a new record for the Corvallis interscholastic by going 10 feet, eight inches in the vault. D. Davis won the sixth point with a throw of the hammer of 129 feet which was good for third place. Davis arrived home this morning and the other boys will be along tomorrow or the next day.

Bolton qualified in the dashes but was beat out in the finals. Perry, the mile runner, fared somewhat the same as Boylon of Pendleton, both losing places.

The points won by the different schools are:

Washington High, Portland, 38; Vancouver, 14; Salem, 11; Columbia university, 11; Pendleton, 8; Lincoln High, Portland, 6; La Grande, 6; St. Johns, 5; Dayton, 5; Eugene, 3; Medford, 3, and Cottage Grove, 3.

The winning team was presented with a beautiful silver loving cup, the gift of W. J. Kerr, president of the agricultural college. The winners of the relay race were awarded a silver cup presented by the Delta Omega fraternity and the highest individual point winner received a silver cup, the gift of the college associations of Portland and Salem students.
