No Referendum Attachment and Work Can Go on Immediately.

(Pendleton East Oregonian.) With the expiration Saturday the time for filing referendum petitions and no such petition having been filed to hold up the additional appropriation for the Eastern Oregon branch hospital the state board is now free to proceed with the establishment of the institution adjacent to this city.

That the plans for the buildings are almost completed and that work will be undertaken soon is stated by Governor Oswald West. For many weeks past State Architect Knighton has been at work upon the plans for the buildings and it is expected he will have them completed by June 1. Bids for the construction of the buildings will then be asked for and the con-

According to Governor West the board will first build the main administration building and a wing on either side, the other wings proposed being added later on as needed. The heating plant and laundry buildings will also bebuilt at once. The state has already made arrangements with the O.-W. R. & N. company for the construction of a spur through the rear of the branch asylum grounds so as to permit of the unloading of fuel and supplies right at the institu-
