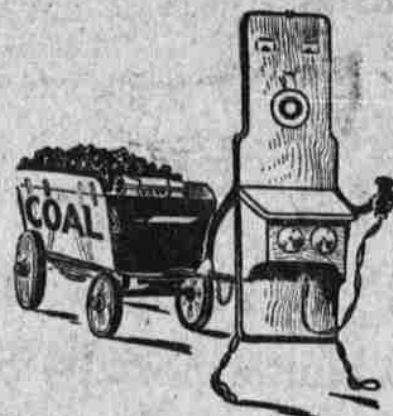

WITH RECORD MEDAL IN POLE VAULT MILLERING RETURNS.

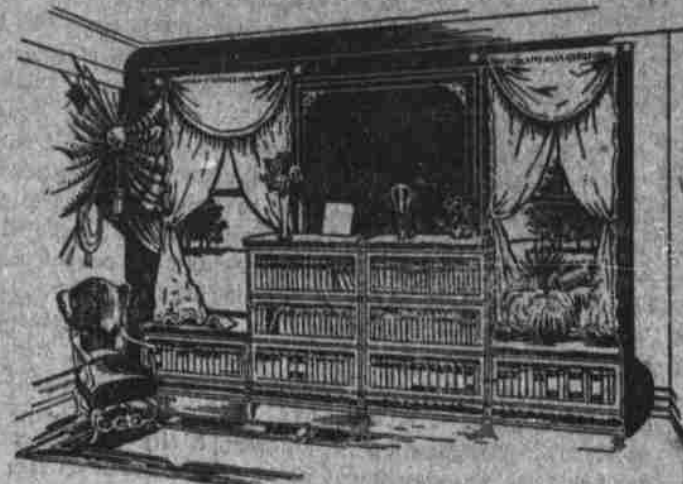
Team Has Participated in the Two Big Meets Held by State Schools.

ORDINANCE NO. 525, SERIES 1911.

An ordinance authorizing the mayor and recorder to make a deed to C. T. Darley for lots 5 and 6, Block 13, in Grandy's second addition to La Grande, Oregon, as re-subdivided by the city as shown by the recorded plat thereof.

The city of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the mayor and recorder of the city of La Grande, Oregon, be and they are hereby authorized to make a deed of conveyance to C. T. Darley for lots 5 and 6, in block 13, in Grandy's second addition to La Grande, Oregon, as re-subdivided by the city and as shown by the recorded plat thereof; and the consideration to be paid to the city for said above described lands shall be paid either in cash or lands or some other equivalent of equal value to the lands to be conveyed by the city.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, its approval by the mayor and publication in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer.

Passed the common council on the 17th day of May, 1911, by five members voting therefor.
