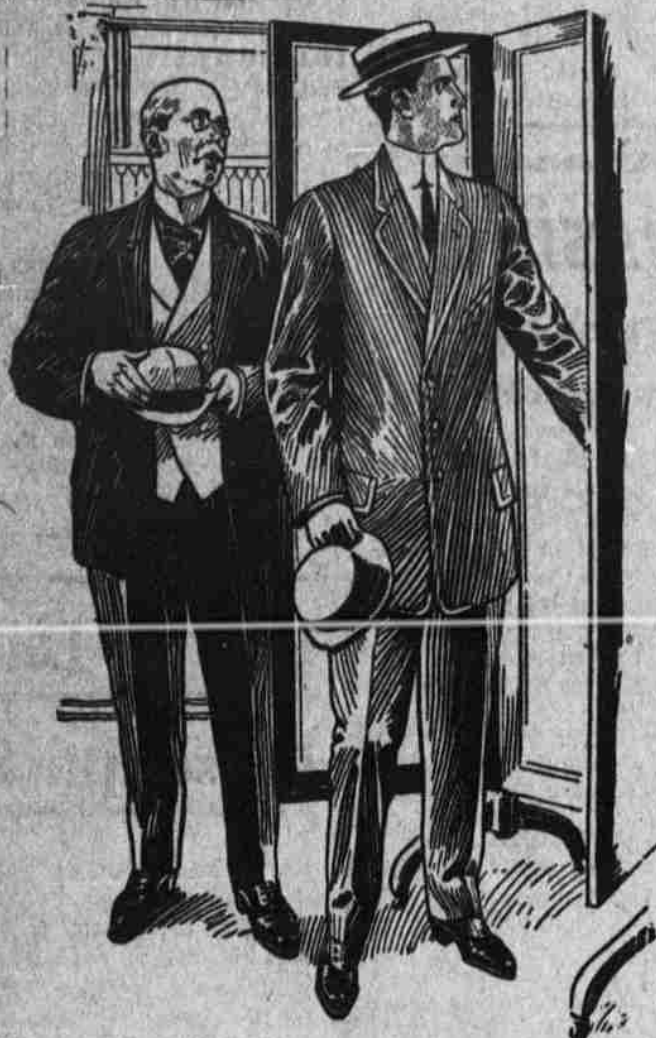

TO ADD AGRICULTURE.

Pearsons Academy at Walla Walla Sees Need of Such a Course.

Pearsons Academy, Walla Walla, May 24.—(Special)—Pearson's academy will have an agricultural course next year, and that they may know the needs of the northwest the academy authorities have written personal letters to the leading ranchmen of this and neighboring states asking for suggestions as to the course. Already more than 50 replies have been received from various parts of the northwest warmly commending the idea and suggesting things to be added to the tentative course drawn up by the school authorities. A number of writers wish special stress put upon teaching conservation of moisture in the soil. Another suggestion is that blacksmithing be added to the wood working already included in the manual training course.
