SPRAYING ORDER OF THE DAY

ORCHARDISTS WILL FIGHT CODLIN THIS WEEK.

A Systematic Fight Against Pest Being Made at the Proper Moment.

This is codlin war week. Throughout the valley orchardists are devoting strenuous efforts to effect perfect spraying and Fruit Inspector Stillwell reports the entire valley diligent in this respect. Spraying is going on everywhere. At this particular time is the proper moment to spray for the codlin moth and the duty of orchardists in this regard is being closely followed. Mr. Stillwell has only recently completed a tour of the valley urging spraying at the proper time and backed by the orchardists' own desire the warfare has been commenced with vigor. Proper spraying this week will rid the trees of the pest, and though the valley is still quite free from moth, the precautions being taken serve to remove what traces there may be.

CITY SCALES IN THE WAY

INTERFERE WITH PAVING OF ELM STREET.

Not Yet Determined Where They Will Be Placed.

Because of the proposed paving of Elm street, the city scales must go and Street Superintendent Stoner today removed the apparatus to a temporary resting place. It has not been decided just where the scales will be placed. Though not very extensively used, the scales have filled a much-needed want because of the fact that there are so few scales in town.

Just what disposition will be made of the scales is not yet determined. They would interfere with paving if moved to Washington and if taken to a point where paving would not interfere, it would be so remote from the city headquarters that the recorder could not attend to the duties of weighing in and out.

Former Sheriff Accused of Murder.

Jonesboro, Ill., May 29.—The case of A. C. Bankstob, former sheriff of Pulaski county, who shot and killed Night Sergeant French of the Cairo police force, was called for trial here today in the Union county circuit court. The killing occurred in Cairo on December 3 last, and the case was brought to this county on change of venue. The trial is expected to attract much attention because of the prominence of the principals in the tragedy.

Suit Against Tobacco "Trust."

Raleigh, N. C., May 29.—The damage case of the Ware-Kramer Tobacco company of Norfolk against the American Tobacco company came up for trial in the federal court here today. The suit is for \$1,200,000 damages for alleged violations of the Sherman anti-trust law.

BIG EXPENSE ELIMINATED.
New Insurance Law in Washington Will Reduce Expenses.

Spokane, May 27.—Defending the new industrial insurance law, effective in the state of Washington on June 8, and explaining the work of the employers' liability commission, to be organized the following day, Governor Hay said at a meeting of manufacturers in Spokane that of \$95,000,000 collected in a standard period by casualty companies only \$15,000,000 had reached the injured employees, the rest being consumed in lawyers' fees, court costs and profits of the companies. He declared that 40 per cent of the cost business of this state consisted of personal injury suits, adding that most of this litigation would be eliminated by the new act. The commission will be composed of George Lee, Spokane, for the legal profession; C. A. Pratt, Tacoma, for the manufacturers, and J. H. Wallace, Seattle, for the employees. Howard J. Hindley, a local newspaper writer, will be secretary. Two test cases will be instituted, the first in the state supreme court on June 18, the second going to the federal court on October 1, when the assessments begin.

Bust of Tom Moore.
Washington, May 27.—A heroic bronze bust of Tom Moore, the Irish poet, was unveiled in the Corcoran art gallery here this afternoon on the eve of the 132nd anniversary of his birth. The bust is intended to commemorate the memorable visit the poet paid to this city in 1804.

In Honor of Dominion Premiers.
London, May 27.—Sir Wilfrid Laurier and the other colonial premiers here to attend the Imperial conference and the coronation ceremonies were the guests of honor at a luncheon given by the Eighty club at the Hotel Cecil today. Lloyd George presided.
