William Peterson.
Dr. William Peterson, principal of McGill university and one of the best known of American educators, was born in Edinburg, Scotland, May 21, 1856. After graduating with high honors from Edinburg University in 1875 he studied at Oxford and at the university of Gottingen. Prior to becoming principal of McGill university in 1895 he held a professorship for several years at the university of Edinburg. Dr. Peterson has received honorary degrees from many noted colleges on both sides of the Atlantic, including St. Andrew's and Aberdeen, in Scotland; Queen's, Toronto, and the University of New Brunswick, in Canada, and Princeton, Yale, Johns Hopkins and the University of Pennsylvania, in the United States. Last December he was chosen chairman of the board of trustees of the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching.
