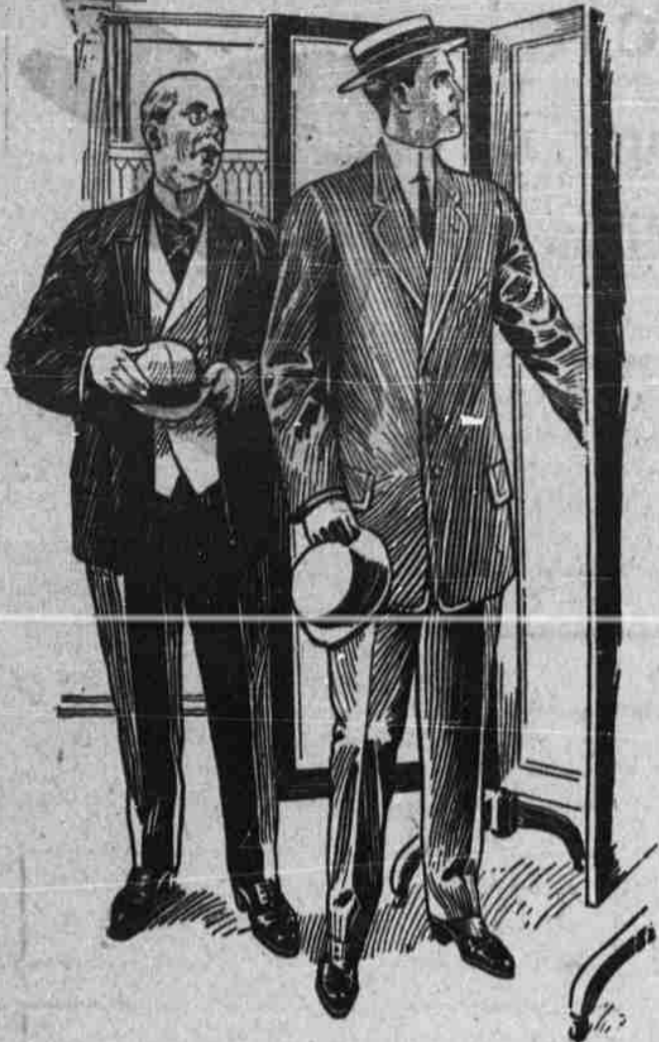

Soldiers to March to Graves of the Dead—Program Later.

La Grande will fittingly pay tribute to soldier dead tomorrow. A program built around rites of the Grand Army of the Republic and the Ladies' Relief Corps, will be carried out during the day. It will be an all day affair and not only are the old veterans to participate in the services at the graves of the dead, but all are invited to attend the service tomorrow morning.
