MIKADO ENGINE NEW BUILDING SET UP OCCUPIED

POWERFUL LOCOMOTIVE WILL BE GIVEN TRIAL HERE.

Six Consigned for La Grande Though Only One Tried Now.

Mikado types of engines are to be tried out on the mountain division out of La Grande. This big locomotive represents the difference in power between the ordinary engines used here and the Mallet type, being calculated to haul between 600 and 700 tons to Kamela. The Mallet engines drag about 1,000 tons over the same grade, 2 1/2 per cent.

Six of these will be set out here but only one is being set up today for a careful trial on the mountains. Its number is 507 and the others run on from that figure.

The Mikado type is somewhat similar to the ordinary engine though it is much larger and considerably powerful. Its advent on mountain service will be watched with interest.

ELEGANTLY FINISHED BUILDING HOUSES EXPRESS.

Shipments Can No Longer Be Left at the Depot Platform.

Spacious and attractive quarters provided for the American Express company office here are now occupied, the agency being moved over this morning from the depot building. Neatly constructed, with plenty of room, the new structures give La Grande as good an express office as now exists along the O.W. The office is stained and grained and varnished until it resembles an up-town suite of offices giving plenty of store room and convenience in all departments.

The company will not be responsible for shipments left at the depot hereafter, announced Agent Hibberd this morning. It has been the rule that heavy shipments could be left on the depot platform, but this can no longer be allowed and all shipments must go directly to the express office.

FOUR THOUSAND HENS SHIPPED TO PORTLAND.

Oklahoma Chicken Raisers Send Big Consignment to Oregon.

More chickens than have been seen at one time in this city for the past month or two anyway, were shipped through La Grande today from Oklahoma points to the portland retail market. There was one car, properly shelved to get the greatest number possible into the car, and an even 4,000 were crowded in. An attendant is with the car, feeding and watering the birds at frequent intervals. There has been good success with the shipment all along, affirmed the attendant and he intends reaching his destination with scarcely a single loss. The breeds are mixed, though all are of marketable size and fatness.

POLO MATCH TOMORROW.

International Affair Opens to Continue Seven Days.

New York, May 31.—Polo enthusiasts and society folk gathered in force at the Meadowbrook club on Long Island today for the opening match in the international cup contests. The tournament will continue until June 7.

The contestants represent the best polo talent of Great Britain and America. The prize is the American challenge cup, now held on this side of the Atlantic. The British team carries the colors of the Hurlingham club and is made up of the best polo players in the British army. King George, himself an ardent polo enthusiast, aided in the selection of the players.

Fifty thousand dollars, half of it donated by the Hurlingham club and the remainder given by public subscription, was raised in England to defray the expenses of sending the team to America to try for the coveted trophy. The British team reached this country early in April and has spent two months in training and practice work. The team is headed by Captain Hardress Lloyd, who is acknowledged to be one of the most skillful players in the world.

The American team is made up of Meadowbrook players, the most of whom played in the matches in England which brought the cup to America. Harry Payne Whitney is the captain of the defending team. The other members are Lawrence and J. M. Waterbury, Jr., and Devereaux Milburn.

The present tournament affords practically the first opportunity for polo enthusiasts in this country to witness a big international match. Since 1886, when the American cup was won by an English team at Newport, the matches for it have been played in England. But the victory of Harry Payne Whitney and his team mates two years ago brought the cup

to this country, after 23 years, and England now must win it back on American soil before it again crosses the water.

MADE HIMSELF BLUSH.

Trick by Which an Actor Achieved a Realistic Stage Effect.

Daniel Frohman in his "Memories of a Manager" tells of a muscular trick by which Mr. F. F. Mackay achieved an astonishing stage effect. It was in Bronson Howard's "One of Our Girls." Mr. Mackay was playing the part of a French count, who, in one of the chief situations of the play, is slapped in the face with a glove by an English officer. Mr. Howard's idea was that the count should become violent and furious at the affront, but Mr. Mackay contended that as he had been shown in the play to be an expert duellist and accustomed to danger he was not likely to lose control of himself.

Mr. Howard saw the point. The result was that the Frenchman received the insult without the movement of a muscle. He stood rigid. Only a flash of the eye for an instant revealed his emotion. Then the audience saw his face grow red and then pale. This was followed by the quiet announcement from the count that he would send his seconds to the Englishman. This exhibition of facial emotion betrayed by the visible rush of blood to the actor's face was frequently noted at the time. It was a muscular trick. Mr. Mackay put on a tight collar for that scene and strained his neck against it until the blood came, and when he released the pressure and the blood receded the effect was reached.

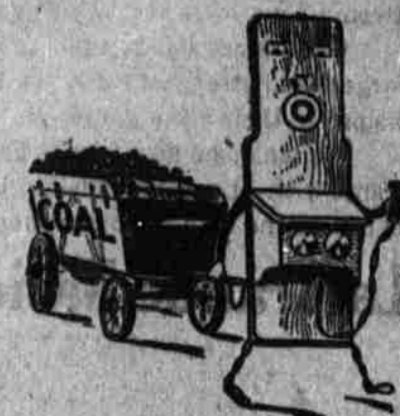
