ORGANIZED

WILL HAVE FUND OF MILLION DOLLARS TO LEND.

Great Benefit to be Derived will Not be Limited to Any One State.

Portland, Ore., June 6.—What is considered the most important move in livestock circles since the location by the Swift interests of a big stockyards and packing plant at Portland is the organization of the Portland Cattle Loan company, which has just been effected. This concern proposes to give financial aid to farmers and stockmen who feed livestock for the Portland market.

It will have a fund of \$1,000,000 to loan, enabling farmers to buy cattle for fattening, and will no doubt add largely to the number of livestock brought to this market.

"This company will enable men with hay and grain to buy cattle for feeding purposes," said D. O. Lively, vice president and manager of the Union Stockyards company. "The great movement of this cattle from Idaho and Oregon to South Dakota and Utah should be checked. The great sums of money now being sent to the Missouri river country for cattle will stay in the Columbia river basin."

The benefits to come from this new concern will not be limited to any one state but will be distributed throughout the Pacific northwest and will doubtless give a great stimulus to the livestock industry.

Meeting of Eagles

Logansport, Ind., June 6.—The annual state convention of the Fraternal Order of Eagles convened here today with a large attendance of delegates and visitors from all over Indiana. A big street parade was the principal feature of the opening day. Tomorrow will be devoted to the business of the convention, including the election of officers for the ensuing year. Conrad H. Mann of Kansas City, Grand Worthy Secretary of the order, is scheduled to deliver an address at the banquet tomorrow evening. The city is decorated in honor of the convention and ample entertainment has been provided for the visitors.

To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon on the 15th day of December, 1909, creating improvement district No. 13 and designating North Fir street, as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 3rd day of May, 1911, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of North Fir street in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon macadam roadway, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefitted by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries said district to be so improved are as follows:
