COMES TO STUDY IRRIGATION

MINISTER FROM NEW SOUTH WALES TO NORTHWEST.

Methods Employed in Irrigated States to be Watched by Visitor.

Spokane, Wash., June 7.—Neil Neilson, minister of lands in the New South Wales cabinet will come to the Pacific slope country early in September to make a thorough investigation of the various systems practiced in the irrigation states according from advices received by the Spokane Chamber of Commerce from Sydney.

Mr. Neilson plans to visit many districts in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana, North Dakota, Wyoming, South Dakota, Texas, Arizona, Nevada, Utah, Oklahoma, Colorado and New Mexico, also the government plants in Nebraska and Kansas, going thence to Chicago and New York. He will confer with the Australian authorities in London and visit the principal cities on the continent.

Civilians to Be Second Lieutenants.

Washington, June 7.—There will be a competitive examination beginning September 5, 1911, for the selection of about 100 civilians for appointment to be second lieutenants in the cavalry, field artillery and infantry of the United States army. The examinations will be conducted at a number of military posts throughout the country, and candidates will be examined at posts as convenient as practicable to their homes.

Persons desiring to enter the competition should address applications to the Adjutant General of the Army, Washington, D. C., accompanied by testimonials as to their moral character and fitness for the position of a commissioned officer in the United States army.

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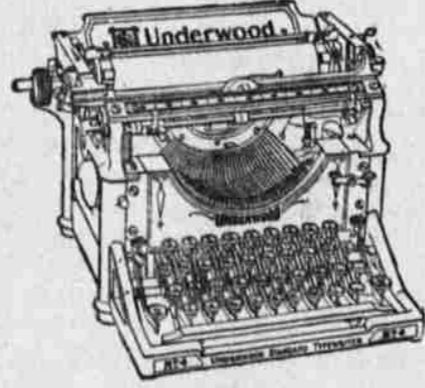
