ROUTINE WORK CLEANED UP

REPORTS, COMMUNICATIONS AND REGULAR BILLS HANDLED.

North Fir Street Residents Remonstrate Against Improvement.

Considerable routine business, such as hearing reports of the officers of the city, reading of bills and communications, was taken up and disposed of by the council last evening at the regular session of that body.

The report of L. M. Hoyt, water superintendent, brought the information that the labor cost of excavating and refilling on Second street for the repair of the Second street pipe line is \$1,394.00.

B. S. Davis, sewer contractor, reported that he is ready to begin work on the sewer on Fir street but cannot do so until an irrigation ditch near the sugar factory is drained as water from it seeps into the sewer excavation. He further reported that he expects to complete the laying of the sewer on Jefferson avenue by Friday.

Adney B. Rogers made known his aspirations for the office of assistant water superintendent in a communication to the council asking that body to take some action on his request for the office.

Last evening was the time set for hearing remonstrances against the macadamizing of North Fir street. A remonstrance signed by a large number of property owners to be affected was received. A petition from a large number of those who signed the petition for the improvement, asking that their names be stricken from the petition, as they said they had been misinformed as to the cost of the macadam paving. The petitions were referred to the street committee.
