EXCURSION TO AUSTRALIA

SPokane Chamber of Com-
merce Arrange for Trip

Will Strengthen Friendship Between
This and Countries Visited

Spokane, Wash., June 9—Arrange-
ments have been completed by the
Spokane Chamber of Commerce for a
trade excursion to Australia and New
Zealand, leaving the Pacific coast in
January 1912, on which the federal
government, the states and territories
and commercial organizations through-
out the union will be invited to send
representatives. The party will be
limited to 100.

R. J. McLean, secretary of the Spo-
kane chamber of commerce an-
nounces the purposes of the excu-
sion, which will occupy 90 days, of
which 40 days will be passed in vis-
iting different cities.

To study the municipal governments
of the cities.

To study the trade and commerce
of the country visited.

To encourage and develop reciprocal
trade relations between the United
States and Australia and New Zeal-
and.

To strengthen the bond of friend-
ship and good will between the people
of the United States and the people of
the countries visited.

To extend a cordial invitation to the
governments of New South Wales,
Victoria, South Australia, Queensland,
Western Australia and New Zealand
and the chambers of commerce of Aus-
tralia and New Zealand to send repre-
sentatives to study the progress of
the United States, to the end that Aus-
tralia and the United States may be
brought into closer commercial rela-
tion.

"We believe this will be one of the
of the most important excursions of
its kind yet attempted by any commer-
cial organization in the United States,"
said Edwin T. Coman, head of the
chamber of commerce, "and we have
also every reason to think that it will
be attended by representative business
men from all over the country.

"The Spokane chamber of commerce
has been assured by an official of the
government of New South Wales that
its invitation to the various govern-
ments will be accepted and that we
shall have the pleasure of entertain-
ing a large party in return."

FIRST STALLION LICENSE.

Prof. Potter of O. A. C. Begins Issu-
ance Under New Stallion Law.

Corvallis, Ore., June 9.—Today the
first stallion license, under the new
state stallion law, was issued by Prof.
E. L. Potter, of the Oregon agricul-
tural college, secretary of the stallion
board, to Frank E. Alley of Roseburg.
Mr. Alley has been especially anxious
to have the honor of receiving the
first license issued by the stallion reg-
istration board, and to this end he put
in his application immediately after
the law was passed, before the board
had formally organized. He has, in
fact, the first four licenses issued, one
for his standard bred trotting horse
"Bonaday," and for three others. The
work of issuing the licenses will now
be pushed rapidly, as some 600 appli-
cations have been received and filed,

and the office is prepared to handle the
immense correspondence incident to
the licensing of the Oregon stallions.
