ly based upon what we saw ourselves, and recommendations we make are made on the grounds of humanity and because the exigencies of the case are such as to warrant it.

Therefore, we recommend and de-

mand as grand jurors and citizens and representatives of the body politic, that a water system of sufficient size and capacity to adequately supply water for the county hospital, be supplied at once and that the provisions be made in connection therewith for conveniently heating sufficient quantities of water for bathing purposes; and that the hospital be thoroughly renovated, cleaned and put in a sanitary condition and that the unfortunate inmates therein be provided with every comfort; and that at such times as the conditions of the inmates require as at present, that a skilled attendant be employed to look after and wait upon the patients therein; and further that if the county physician is too busy to give proper time and attention to the inmates, that another be employed.

We wish especially to thank the court for courtesies, the district attorney and deputy for constant assistance, and the bailiff for faithful services. Having completed our duties at this time we beg to be allowed to adjourn until the further order of the court.
