380 ACRES NEAR SUMMERVILLE TO BE CULTIVATED.

Gasoline Engine and Black and Tackle Will Be Used to Pull Stumps.

C. V. Carson of the Palouse country after looking over the valley this week purchased 380 acres of land northwest of Summerville, through the Geo. H. Currey real estate agency, being the farms of Clark W. Colver and G. L. Gibson. Quite a portion of this land is covered with small timber with a small percentage of larger. Mr. Carson being a man of means his development of this land will be an incentive for other men to experience by his demonstration, how cheaply this character of land can be put under cultivation by adopting improved methods.

Mr. Carson has a 45-horse power gasoline engine and to hear him explain how great big trees will succumb to the block and tackle to the uninitiated seems credulous. We have hundreds of acres of choice land on the foothills and mountain valleys in this county that some day will support hundreds of happy homes. Under the old system of the grubbing hoe and mattock it meant mighty hard and slow work to clear up a farm but by the modern up-to-date methods when capital can see quick returns these mountain possibilities will certainly appeal to them.
