TO BUILD DYKE AT PROVO

UNITED STATES RECLAMATION
SERVICE HAS PLAN.

In Time There Will be 30,000,000 Acres
Reclaimed in the West.

Chicago, Ill., June 9.—The office of the United States reclamation service at Provo, Utah, is planning to build a big dike on Indian Creek about 35 miles from Thistle station, a town on the Denver & Rio Grande railway.

It is estimated that the building work will involve an expenditure by the government of approximately \$200,000. The contractor must move 80,000 cubic yards of earth and 4,800 cubic yards of rock, besides laying 12,100 yards of paving, 1,400 linear feet of drain tile and 1,700 cubic yards of reinforced concrete. Bids for the work will be received until 2 o'clock in the afternoon of June 19 at the office of the service in Provo.

The reclamation service, which was established by the government through the efforts of the National Irrigation congress, whose 19th annual sessions are to be held in Chicago on Dec. 5 to 9 of this year, is to spend \$48,000,000 in reclamation work during the coming four years. The expenditures in years past have amounted to approximately \$70,000,000. In time it is expected that 30,000,000 acres of arid lands will be reclaimed in the west, while it is not improbable that within a few years the government may be similarly employing its funds for the reclamation of swamp and overflowed lands in the east, of which there are 80,000,000 acres. The furthering of this latter movement is to be one of the undertakings of the National Irrigation congress this year.

O. A. C. DORMITORY GIRLS ELECT.

Yamhill County Girl to Preside Over
Waldo Hall Club Next Year.

Corvallis, Ore., June 9.—At the annual meeting of the Waldo Hall club, composed of the residents of the girls' dormitory at the Oregon agricultural college, Miss Clara Wallen, a junior in the domestic science course from Adams, Yamhill county, was elected president for the coming year. Other officers elected were as follows: First vice president, Lucy Crawford, '13; Ashland; second vice president, Della Mays, '14, Hillsboro, Washington county; secretary, Florence Starbird, '12, Portland; treasurer, Kate O'Connor, '14, Montague, California.

The Waldo Hall staff, composed of Dr. A. Z. Cryan, dean of women, Miss A. A. Pettingell, housekeeper, and Esther V. Leech, assistant to the dean, has just issued an attractive booklet of information regarding the dormitory, its advantages and accommodations, and the house rules for the coming year, so that parents may see exactly what care will be given their daughters should they elect to live in Waldo Hall rather than in private houses. The expense is less than in outside rooms, and the house regulations insure regular hours for study, rest and recreation. There are social functions provided for the dormitory dwellers, too, that are not open to the outside residents.
