REDUCE RUNNING TIME FROM THE EAST

NOS. FIVE AND SIX TO HAVE A
FASTER SCHEDULE.

Service Will Also Be Extended on to
Seattle From Portland.

Arrangements for reducing the running time of O.-W. R. & N. trains No. 5 and No. 6 between Portland and Chicago and for extending the service through between Portland and Seattle have been completed by R. B. Miller, traffic manager, thus providing the 11th train each way a day between Portland and Puget Sound. This is the announcement made at Portland yesterday. The new service will begin June 19.

Although the schedule has not yet been worked out, it will provide for the departure of train No. 5 from Chicago about 8 o'clock in the morning and its arrival here about noon of the third day.

Service out of Seattle will be at noon and departure from Portland will be at about 8 p. m.

The train will run solid from Seattle to Chicago, providing for the fourth train by the O.-W. R. & N. company between Portland and the Sound. The Northern Pacific now runs four trains each way daily and the Great Northern three trains.

The schedule will provide for close connection from Seattle with Southern Pacific train No. 15, leaving here at 7.45 p. m.
