HOG CHOLERA IN OREGON

PENDELTON DOCTOR RELATES PREVENTATIVE METHODS.

First Time in History That Disease Has Hit Eastern Oregon.

Alarming Oregon swine raisers, the dreaded cholera has broken out at several points in the state for the first time in the history of veterinary science here. In the statement of a Pendleton paper.

Dr. W. H. Lytle, in Pendleton yesterday, outlined the campaign which the state will wage in an effort to eradicate the fatal contagious ailment before it spreads to any greater extent.

In Umatilla county hogs near Athena are infected and cholera has been found near Portland and at Heppner as well. Whether it has extended to other parts of the state is not yet known, but only the three sections mentioned have reported up to date.

Goes to Athena.

Dr. W. H. Lytle, state veterinarian, left yesterday afternoon for Athena to make a thorough inspection and to notify swine breeders of the danger of infection and the need of precautionary measures.

"Keep your hogs away from water courses," is the injunction of Dr. Lytle to swine owners.

"Water carries cholera germs," he said yesterday. "Since 90 per cent of cholera cases are fatal, the situation is serious enough to warrant our almost undivided attention."

While the state is somewhat handicapped by lack of facilities, preparations are being made to wage relentless war against the new foe of the porkers.

Will Make Serum.

In the laboratory of the state bacteriologist at Portland an effort will be made to manufacture a serum, which is the only known preventative. By inoculating hogs that are known to have been exposed to infection, the spread of the disease may be checked, although there is no known remedy for cholera once it gains a hold.

The first attempt at manufacture of the serum will be largely experimental, since this will be the first time it has been required in Oregon and it cannot be purchased.

Dr. Lytle will visit Heppner following his Athena inspection. From there he will proceed to Portland, where his campaign will be opened in earnest.

Meanwhile he is urging all farmers who are in an infected district to keep their hogs away from the water courses. Proper quarantines have been established.

Passing of Canfields Club House.

Saratoga, N. Y., June 15.—In accordance with the terms of its recent purchase the village of Saratoga Springs today took possession of Richard A. Canfield's famous club house, where in days gone by fortunes were wont to change hands on the turn of a card. When Saratoga was a "wide open" town the Canfield Canfield house was known as the greatest gambling palace in America and also the most magnificent. Canfield bought the property for \$500,000 and spent an additional quarter of a million in furnishing the house and beautifying the grounds. After the furnishings had been removed the village obtained the property for 150,000 dollars. The grounds are now to become a free park and the great club house and dining halls will be used as a free casino and reading rooms.

Celebrate 1,000 Anniversary

Paris, June 15.—Many tourists from America and elsewhere have joined the pilgrimage of visitors to Normandy to witness the elaborate celebrations in honor of the 1,000th anniversary of the founding of the Duchy of Normandy. The fetes commemorating the historic event begin this week and will continue through the greater part of the summer. A series of elaborate pageants will be given illustrating the history of Normandy and extolling the lives and works of Cornille, Malherbe, Flaubert, and other celebrated Normans. The city of Rouen is to be the scene of the principal festivities, though every town of Normandy will share in the celebration.

Baptist Missionary Convention.

Providence, R. I., June 15.—The New England Baptist missionary convention met in this city today for its 37th annual session. Mayor Fletcher welcomed the delegates at the opening session and response was made by Rev. Samuel J. Comfort of Boston. This afternoon the convention listened to an address by President R. L. Diggs of the Lynchburg, Va., Seminary. The sessions will continue until Monday.
