### TIMBER TRACT SOLD.

E. W. Rumble Disposes of His Timber Land to Big Mill Concern.

E. W. Rumble confirms the sale of his timber land northwest of town, 1600 acres, to Spokane capitalists composing the Gwynne Lumber company that has been operating in Culebasac, Idaho, says a Wallowa paper.

This sale undoubtedly means the erection of a big saw mill of from 35,000 to 50,000 daily capacity. Tramways will be built from the mill near the Fitzpatrick place up into the timber.

The headquarters, offices, etc., of the company will be in Enterprise, and this big, new industry means much to this city and surrounding country.

Additional bodies of timber near this holding are now being negotiated for, and the company will own at least 20,000,000 feet.

Mr. Rumble says he understands the mill will be erected this summer, work beginning as soon as possible.
