**ELGIN RECORDS  
A VICTORY**

**LA GRANDE LOSES ITS SECOND  
GAME OF YEAR.**

**McInnis Hit Hard—"Mysterious"  
Mitchell Twirls for Elgin.**

La Grande stubbed her toe yesterday and lost the second game of the year when Elgin nosed out a ninth inning victory in an irrational game of town ball dotted with brilliant playing, final score 12 to 11. Varied indeed was the performance and the small crowd yelled lustily and groaned with remorse with startling frequency. It was the first time Elgin has walloped La Grande this year and the fans and fannettes there don't care if Elgin wins any more games this year or not. "Mysterious" Mitchell, so it is said, twirled for Elgin and though La Grande found him for nine safe bingles, he got away with the game through the generosity of the La Grande fielders, coupled with a swat feat such as McInnis seldom suffers. Three times the ball was lost and the batters cantered home.

Punk, rank, brilliant, interesting in the extreme are some of the adjectives correctly applied. In fact, both teams were prone to err and it was surprising how often La Grande won the game only to lose it. McDonald and Bradley were the most consistent players for La Grande, McDonald's two bagger gaining a lead in the ninth that looked like victory but Elgin got a hit over in the last of the ninth when with bases full De Boie, the weakest hitter in the Elgin team and who had fanned time after time, laced out a clean hit that did the business. The unexpected happened all the time and that was why the game was really a thriller notwithstanding that it was a townball exhibition.

Nearly a hundred from La Grande attended, forming almost one third of the total attendance. A special train was run for the occasion.

Mires was the only outfielder to get a putout. The others, and Mires, too, under-ran and misjudged several. In fact the whole La Grande team played as if tired, very probably brought on from the three games of the week. To players used to weekly games, five in eight days is too much.

Elgin broke into the home run proposition with a vim. When McInnis

was in holes he generally squirmed out and it was when the sea seemed so glazy that Elgin hit him most.

"Mysterious" Mitchell or Walker, or whatever the erstwhile Pacific coast twirler and O. A. C. coacher is, was not invincible by any means. He is tricky and caught La Grande napping. Even Childers was pickled on bases. Aside from his wonderful speed which battered against Hughes, and a terrific spit ball drop, he has no great variety or any great control. However, there is some question as to who the fellow really was. He was a stranger and a pitcher, too. Take that for true.

Aubin, the Billikie chief of yore sat in the grand stand yesterday. Bradley isn't credited with a hit although he got on every time but one. He found Mr. Stranger as did all the others.

McInnis had his batting eye strong yesterday, getting two clean ones and a sacrifice.

Kail on first booted several, though two of them were bad throws from Childers.

Stoddard was back in the game yesterday.

Umpire Keeney, officiating by request, got through the hair-raising game nicely.
