esty's disposal by a number of noblemen and important officials including the Earl of Lonsdale; Lord Ivesigh; Lord Howard, de Waldem and Lady Naylor-Leyland, daughter of William C. Chamberlain of Cleveland, Ohio. Alone among the various countries colonies protectorates, spheres of influence and dependencies including in the British empire Ireland will be unrepresented officially at the coronation.

There are of course Irish peers, troops, police and individual visitors on hand in large numbers but not a soul on behalf of the Irish people. The nationalists members of parliament have always refused to participate in any of England's important official shows.

They were unrepresented at the Queen Victoria Jubilee; the diamond jubilee and at the coronation and funeral of King Edward.

On the present occasion it was agreed that inasmuch as Ireland seems to be on the eve of home rule, circum-

stances have changed considerably, and it was also agreed, however, that inasmuch as the people of the Emerald Isle are still deprived of their constitutional rights they would not even yet be justified in taking any part in the coronation ceremonies.

GREEK ASSAULTED BY THUGS

Two Men Held on Charges of Assault With Intent to Rob.

James Collons and Frank Freeman are held today by police authorities and will be tried before Justice Williams tomorrow on a charge of assault with intent to rob. A Greek named Gost Garelas was assaulted, it is asserted by these two men and severely beaten. He sustained a broken wrist and two ribs were cracked by the assault, said to have been instigated by intent to rob. Mr. Karelas is the complaining witness and claims that the police have the proper men in custody.

Mr. Taft had recently graduated from Yale and was employed as a reporter on a Cincinnati newspaper and at the same time studying law. Miss Heron had lately finished her education at Cincinnati university and was engaged in teaching in a private school. The bridegroom was in his 29th year while the bride had just passed her 25th birthday anniversary. It is an interesting coincidence that exactly 22 years after the day of his marriage Mr. Taft was nominated for president of the United States.

Washington, June 19.—Taft did not appear at the executive office today. Instead with school boy friends from Cincinnati he motored to Chevy Chase club and lunched elaborately. Tonight a silver reception will be held at the white house lawn which is elaborated decorated, and he will assist his mother because it is feared his mother might not be able to stand the strain. Decoration of the lawn include myriads of light strung in the trees. The president and Mrs. Taft will stand on a silver-edged carpet under a shower of silver lights to greet the thousands who have been invited to attend the function.
