MOST VALUABLE DRAFT
COW BORN.

What is generally conceded to be the most valuable draft type of cows ever foaled in Union county is in possession of Willis Moss, of Moss channel district, today, and it is doubtful if an even \$1,000 would buy the little fellow. The cow has a remarkable parentage. The dam is a draft mare owned by Mr. Moss, which 10 days before the colt was foaled, weighed 2,800 pounds, a remarkable figure. The sire, owned by Albert Hunter, weighed seven tons.

Both sire and dam are purely bred registered Percherons and the dam is of course in a class by herself because of her enormous weight. The colt is a male and is perfect in every way. There is no question among horse-fanciers, but that the colt will become one of the finest animals ever bred in this valley, where fine horseflesh is so common that only the very best attracts particular attention.

ORDINANCE NO. 535, SERIES 1911. An ordinance authorizing the mayor and recorder to enter into a contract with J. A. McCarthy for the use of certain property for a city pound and to create a city pound and declaring an emergency.

The city of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The mayor and recorder of the city of La Grande are hereby authorized to enter into a contract with J. A. McCarthy for the use of the following property to wit: Lots 16, 18, 20, block 145, Chaplin addition to city of La Grande, to be used as a city pound.

The property described in section 1 and the enclosure therein or building thereon are hereby created a city pound and the poundmaster of the

city of La Grande is hereby directed and authorized to impound any animal therein under existing ordinances in the manner and as the same was impounded in other city pounds within said city.

Section 2. Inasmuch as it is necessary for the immediate preservation

of the peace, health and safety of the city of La Grande and its inhabitants that an official pound be established.

Emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the mayor and publication in one issue of the Evening Observer.

Passed the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, this 21st day of June, 1911, by seven councilmen voting therefor.
