GRANGERS WANT GOOD ROADS BUT NOT BOULEVARDS.

Medical Springs Is Meeting Place of Pomona Grange.

Medical Springs, June 27.—(Special)—A large number of grangers from Union and Baker counties assembled here June 24th to attend the regular meeting of the Union County Pomona grange which met with Medical Springs Grange 427. The morning session was held in the hall. The following resolution was adopted.

"Whereas, the grange stands for good roads when built so as to best develop the country and believes that improved highways should be built from the places of market into the surrounding country, and,

"Whereas, there is a growing demand for good roads by pleasure seekers and special interests for selfish purposes without the best interests of the country in view,

"Therefore, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Union County Pomona Grange in regular session assembled that we are unalterably opposed to the creating of new highways or of the improvement of special automobile boulevards at the expense of the taxpayers of this county."

Resolutions were also adopted favoring the doing away of the swearing in of voters on election day and of prohibiting of treating to intoxicating liquors. The county grange is to give a banner to the subordinate grange in the county who will do the best work this winter.
