## AUTO RUN TO HATCHERY

### MACHINES TO LEAVE INDEPENDENTLY JULY 1.

Gather at Noon for Big Picnic by the Hatchery Is Plan Now.

July 16 will be the day when all the members of the Union County Motor club will make the fish hatchery on the Minam their mecca and the orders have gone forth for the line of march as it were. Each machine will start from its respective garage or barn at any time the night before the 16th or on the 17th with the only proviso that the parties are to be assembled at the hatchery at noon sharp. Camping facilities have been provided, by the directors at a recent meeting, and the trip will be so enjoyable that it is believed nearly every machine in the county will be gathered there that day. ### Worlds Steel Federation.

Brussels, July 5.—A highly notable congress of the iron masters of the world, the first gathering of its kind ever held, assembled in Brussels today to discuss questions of general interest and importance to the iron and steel industry and also, it is said, to form a permanent international organization of iron and steel makers. The American iron and steel industry is well represented at the congress. Among the Americans who will have a prominent part in the proceedings are Charles M. Schwab, Judge E. H. Gary, chairman of the board of the United States Steel corporation, and James A. Farrell, president of the corporation. According to announcement the conference is intended to establish a "better understanding among the steel producers of the world. It is said no attempt will be made to fix prices or to regulate the market.

and the recorder of the city of La Grande is hereby directed to prepare a special assessment roll in accordance with the foregoing assessment; enter the said assessments in the docket of city liens.

Sec. 2. It is further provided that said assessment shall become due and payable immediately after the same is entered in the docket of city liens and delinquent within ten (10) days thereafter.

Sec. 3. When the recorder of the city of La Grande shall have completed the special assessment roll in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance, he shall without delay, give at least five (5) days' notice in one or more of the newspapers having general circulation in said city, of the time when such assessments will become delinquent, and also that

said assessments, may be paid in installments, provided each property owner shall make application therefor within ten (10) days from the date of the first publication of said notice. Said application to be made under and by virtue of the provisions of Chapter 5, Title 26, of Lord's Oregon Laws. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its approval by the mayor, and published in one issue of the Evening Observer. Passed the common council on this the 28th day of June, 1911, by 6 councilmen voting therefor. Approved by the mayor this 29th day of June, 1911.

### Game Warden "in Wrong."

As a result of the recent visit of Deputy Game Warden E. L. Thompson of Portland to Bendleton several Umatilla county citizens have been roused to wrath and one member of the fish and game association declared himself strongly today in denunciation of the methods employed, says the Live Wire.

"Thompson came to Umatilla county as a guest at a banquet," he said, "and pursued methods which were hardly sportsmanlike. He fished with two men and put fish in their baskets and after thus obtaining their confidence, arrested them for violating the law. Then he visited Wenaha Springs and

got into the good graces of a Japanese employe in order to obtain a fish for evidence.

"No wonder the fish which he intended to use for evidence disappeared at a local hotel, where he left it. It looks to me like he tried to make a record at Umatilla county's expense and did not care much how he made it."

### ORDINANCE NO. 588, SERIES 1911.

An ordinance declaring the cost of improving Elm street from the north line of Washington avenue to the south curb line of Jefferson avenue; determining the property benefited thereby, levying an assessment thereon to defray the costs and expenses of the improvement; providing for the assessment roll of the same and directing the entry of said assessment in the docket of city liens; providing a time when the same shall become delinquent and requiring the city recorder to prepare a special assessment roll in accordance with the assessment herein levied and to collect said assessment.

The city of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the council has considered the proposed assessment of the property benefited by the improvement of Elm street from the north line of Washington avenue to the south curb line of Jefferson avenue, and all objections made thereto, and hereby ascertains, determines and

declares the whole cost of said improvement in the manner provided by resolution, duly passed by the council on the 19th day of April, 1911, to be the sum of \$6,470.74, and the property hereafter described is specially benefited by said improvement, and the special and peculiar benefits accruing to each lot or parcel thereof or parcel of land within the assessment district and which is so specially benefited by reason of said improvement, and which has been equitably apportioned among all blocks, lots, parts of blocks and lots, land and real estate bounding, abutting, contiguous, fronting and adjacent and tributary to such improvement and within the district created for the purpose of, making such improvement to the extent of the benefits to such lots, parts of lots, land and real estate by reason of such improvement and in no case in excess of said benefits, and the amount set opposite the description or number of each lot or part thereof or parcel of land for which said respective parcels is assessed, is as follows:
