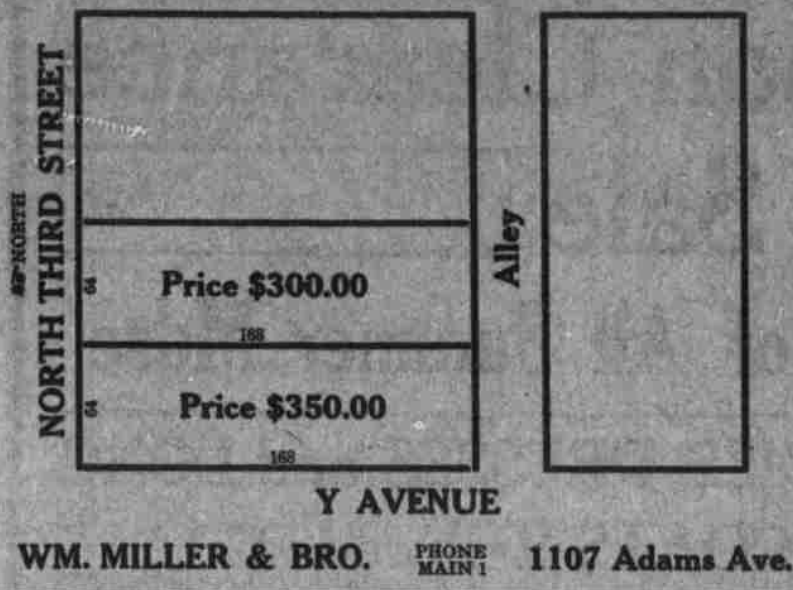

BIG RACES PLANNED.

California Men Spend Big Sums to Pupist Boats.

San Francisco, Cal., July 11.—(Special)—San Francisco spending something like \$50,000 to win the honorary title of the Pacific coast, with a \$3,000 purse divided three ways, five northern Californians are counting the days for the starting gun at the Astoria, Oregon, Centennial motor boat regatta, opening September 4, next, and lasting a week. Those who are building boats here for this regatta are: C. T. Mitchell, San Francisco Yacht club; Prentiss N. Gray, 110 Market street, this city; Nunne Brothers, Sacramento, Sam Pankos, Sacramento, and Captain Wood Watson, Vallejo.

There are two big races in which these men are interested, the displacement boat championship and the hydroplane class. The purses in these two events total \$5,500 and the winner in each of these two classes will have to travel about 40 miles an hour.

The "Wolf II" of Portland is the coast champion at present. She made 31 1-2 miles an hour last year over a surveyed course and the owner says she can do 40 miles an hour today. Captain Wolf is not pinning all his faith on the veteran. He has launched and tried out the "Oregon Wolf," and when but 11 days off the ways during the Rose Festival at Portland and was a private burst of speed Wolf says he will keep the championship honors in the rose city.

Two Women in Legislature.

Spokane, Wash., July 11.—Spokane's delegation of 10 representatives and five senators in the state legislature of 1913 will include two women, if the plans outlined today by officers of the Women's Non-Partisan Political league and the Political Equality league of Washington are successful. The candidates probably will be Mrs. A. P. Fassett, president of the first named organization, and Mrs. May Arkwright Hutton, wife of a millionaire mining operator, who gave material assistance in securing the ballot for the women of Washington at the last state election. Mrs. Fassett announced that members of the organization have studied the laws of the state and will make their campaign on issues affecting women's status and juvenile legislation. Mrs. Fassett added it is too early to make a definite announcement of her candidacy, but said that the State Federation of Women's club at a recent meeting endorsed the plan to support women candidates as state representatives during the coming campaign.

The convention will nominate candidates for governor and for all other state offices to be voted on at the election next November. The official call omits all mention of instructions for United States senator, and the general understanding is that none will be given.

Several spirited contests are in view for places on the state ticket and it is thought probable that the convention may not complete its work before Wednesday.

Washington, D. C., July 11.—Under the direction of Rear Admiral R. O. Holliday, arrangements are practically completed for the education by mail of officers in the naval service. Admiral Holliday is chief of the bureau of yards and docks and will give two years' course of instruction for assistant engineers. The scheme has been approved by the secretary of the navy.
