LEPROSY IS MASTERED

DOCTOR NOW IN PORTLAND IS SAID TO HAVE CURE.

Medical Association Hears Discussion of What Can Be Done.

(Portland Telegram.)

Leprosy is being cured. One of the physicians who is doing the work, in the employ of the Hawaiian board of health, Dr. J. T. Wayson, is a Portland guest, and will speak to the State Medical association on the work being done by the humane Hawaiian administration. Giving a hideous setting for science's latest triumph over the "incurables" of earlier times, Dr. Wayson has with him several wax casts of leper faces and limbs which make the flesh crawl as they are looked upon.

"We cure leprosy, but only when we get it in early stages," said Dr. Wayson. "There is no cure for those advanced types, such as the casts illustrate, except the cast of a foot. That foot is of a Chinese. When he was brought to me, he had a bad lesion on the foot, and the disease was spreading. We treated him vigorously, and all parts of the body responded, except the foot, of which I have a cast here. We finally amputated the foot, and now the Chinese is as well and free of leprosy as if never tainted."

"Our cures have been four in number so far. We have proven that the cure is absolutely certain, if the case is taken early. Now the great effort is to get the confidence of the natives, so that they will be brought to us as soon as afflicted, that we may reach the disease in its curable stage. But owing to the habit of the natives of hiding the disease when they discover it, and discovery by others only when an aggravated form is developed, the beneficial work is slow. Ultimately, we hope to win the necessary confidence that will bring the afflicted to us in the very first stage, and then we can depopulate Molokai island."

Dr. Wayson is superintendent of

the Kalihl receiving hospital in Honolulu, which has been built with the specific purpose of determining if a cure cannot be effected from the terrible disease, before sending the natives over to the leper colony on Molokai.

Dr. Wayson claims no new discovery in the work of the Hawaiian medical staff, but merely application of familiar principles to leprosy cure. Tonics and carbon dioxide snow are features of the cure applied with success.
