Offices are now being fitted up in the Despain building, corner of Court and Cottonwood streets and business will be begun at once with Judge J. W. Maloney acting as manager, assisted by Roland Iyer.

The officers of the new association as elected are: President, H. D. Rosenberg; vice president, L. D. Eaton; secretary-treasurer-manager, J. W. Maloney; directors, W. W. Harrah, H. B. Rosenberg and L. D. Eaton. The incorporators were W. W. Harrah, W. R. Campbell, J. R. Porter, John Raschmann, H. J. Rosenberg and J. W. Maloney. The company is incorporated for \$3,000 and the stock is divided among the following farmers in addition to the officers and incorporators: T. R. Hampton, E. P. Tulloch, Rudolph Sheel, Frank Snyder, William Caldwell, W. M. Slusher, V. H. Moore, A. Ruppe, A. I. Molstrom, David Peebler, Herman Suhl, B. E. Bowman, C. H. Rosenberg, W. J. Stockman, John Zeitz, R. O. Earnheart, and B. E. Anderson.

It is not the purpose of this organization to conflict in any way with the different grain companies or buying agencies in the county but its activities will be confined solely to assisting the members to dispose of their products at the best prices obtainable. MILTON MAN A SUICIDE

TIMES TO KILL WIFE BEFORE HE ENDS HIS OWN LIFE.

Dive's Headfirst Into Well—Suicide a Man of 60 Years of Age.

Pendleton, July 19.—The East Oregonian said last night:

After falling in an attempt to murder his wife and kill himself with a hatchet, Fred Geisler, a resident of Sunnyside near Milton, last night dove head first down a 30-foot well, breaking his neck in the plunge. This is the substance of a communication received last night by Coroner Ralph Folsom, who left for the scene of the tragedy on the early train this morning.

According to telephonic advice from Milton Geisler, who was about 60 years old and an old resident of that section of the county, has recently become a religious fanatic and it is believed by many that ill health of body had affected his mind.

He had been married to his wife barely over a month. Last night about 9 o'clock without any warning, he seized a hatchet and attempted to strike her but his purpose was thwarted by his intended victim, who grappled with her husband and wrenched the weapon from his hands.

When thus deprived of his instrument of destruction, he ducked his head between his hands and ran for
