ELGIN COUNTRY TO START HAR-VEST AT ONCE.

Heat Does Not Harm and Great Pros pects Are Seen.

The Union county wheat crop which is credited by everyone in a position to be a jude to outstrip anything in history of wheat growing in this county is described in detail by a special dispatch from Elgin to a Portland pa-

"Within a very few days Union county will be in the midst of its greatest harvest. A careful examination of the fields in all sections of the county gives indications that the yield will approximate 500,000 to 2,000,000 bushels from an acreage slightly less than that commonly sowed in small grains.

"That this year's crop of wheat in Union county promises a yield of virtually 50 per cent more than that of a year ago is due to two conditions: first, the greater acreage, and second. the excellent growing weather and amount of rainfall through the season. A survey of the wheat fields in the territory immediately surrounding Elgin she vs a splendid stand of grain, and it is predicted by flouring mill men of the valley that there will be shipped from th's point approximately 450,000 bushets.
