IMBLER PEOPLE WANT DIVISION

TAXPAYERS OF THAT DISTRICT APPEAL FOR DECISION.

County Court Defers Action Until the Commissioners Appear.

Imbler's school district war was transplanted to La Grande today when a large number of taxpayers who are interested in the proposed division of the Imbler school district, came to La Grande for the purpose of placing their dispute before the county court. In view of the fact that the commissioners were not present, Judge Henry postponed the hearing until August 3, the regular meeting date of the county court.

Some of the Imbler people want a new high school and others want to divide the district. The strife has been under way for several weeks and it is believed the action of the county court next month will settle it.

WHEAT CROP IS BUMPER

ELGIN COUNTRY TO START HARVEST AT ONCE.

Heat Does Not Harm and Great Prospects Are Seen.

The Union county wheat crop which is credited by everyone in a position to be a judge to outstrip anything in history of wheat growing in this county is described in detail by a special dispatch from Elgin to a Portland paper:

"Within a very few days Union county will be in the midst of its greatest harvest. A careful examination of the fields in all sections of the county gives indications that the yield will approximate 500,000 to 2,000,000 bushels from an acreage slightly less than that commonly sowed in small grains."

"That this year's crop of wheat in Union county promises a yield of virtually 50 per cent more than that of a year ago is due to two conditions: first, the greater acreage, and second, the excellent growing weather and amount of rainfall through the season. A survey of the wheat fields in the territory immediately surrounding Elgin shows a splendid stand of grain, and it is predicted by flouring mill men of the valley that there will be shipped from this point approximately 450,000 bushels. While there is a decrease of virtually 20 per cent in the acreage,

the per centage of fall sowing is fully 10 per cent more than usual.

"While there are stretches that will harvest 60 bushels an acre in the vicinity of Elgin, it is a common sight to see fields that will range between 45 and 50 bushels. Sixty-bushel yields in bygone years have only been harvested in spots, but the percentage of such productions is much greater this year than ever before. Therefore taking the harvest field for field, the average this year will be the greatest ever known in Union county.

"Warm weather is needed to ripen the wheat safely and barring hot winds or a wet harvest, the crop is practically made at this time.

"Barley will range about 50 bushels to the acre as an average, an unusually good showing, even were the rainfall more plentiful than it has been this season. There are fields in the county that will average better than 50 bushels but this is too high an average for the entire district.

"The showing in oats is smaller than usual. This is due entirely to the decreased acreage, because the crop to the acre is a record breaker.

"Alfalfa is making the same heavy showing in this section as has been noted in all portions of Oregon."
