RED CROSS MEN AT PENDLETON

DEMONSTRATE FIRST AID TO THE INJURED.
 Car Sent Out by Red Cross Society, Reaches Pendleton.

Under auspices of the American Red Cross society, railroad men of Pendleton and all other citizens who may be interested will tomorrow night be enabled to hear a lecture on, and see demonstrated, the latest methods of rendering first aid to the injured, says the Pendleton East Oregonian.

The lecture and demonstration will begin promptly at 8 o'clock tomorrow evening in a special car that will arrive in the city at 5 o'clock tomorrow afternoon. The car will be brought to this city from Portland on No. 2, which reaches Pendleton at 5 p. m. This car will be located in a convenient place in the O. W. R. & N.

Dr. M. J. Shields is in charge of the car and together with Dr. Glasgow will deliver the lecture and give demonstrations, in order that every one, especially railroad men, may be instructed in the matter of rendering the most effective assistance, under difficulties to any injured person. These cars are being sent all over the country by the Red Cross society.
