WORK RUSHED ON GUILD HALL

FOUNDATION FOR STRUCTURE IS NEARLY DONE.

High Basement Walls Will Give Splendid Floor Space.

Mexican Railways Face Strike.

El Paso, Texas, August 4.—Though nothing has developed to verify the report that a general strike would be declared tomorrow on the National Railways of Mexico system, it is the general belief among those acquainted with the situation that the threatened strike is certain to materialize at an early date. The dissatisfaction of the employees, particularly the firemen and brakemen, has been on the increase for some time. While wages and hours of labor figure in the controversy to some extent, the real cause of the trouble is found in the complaint of the Mexicans that the better positions, such as those of conductors and engineers, are held by Americans and that the latter are paid higher wages than are the natives.
