



SENTENCE HOGG ON SATURDAY

NO NOTICE OF APPEAL OR NEW TRIAL MOTION YET.

Defendant Convicted of a Statutory Charge Last Evening.

Tomorrow, Saturday, at 10 o'clock, Circuit Judge Knowles will pronounce sentence on William Hogg, convicted last evening of rape. The case came to an end about 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon when, after deliberating two hours, the jury convicted the defendant of assaulting the crippled and half-witted daughter of Mr. Moffat of High Valley. The trial had lasted since Monday morning and was marked throughout most of the testimony taking with nauseating testimony.

At noon today no action had been taken relative to filing a motion for a new trial or serving notice of appeal. It is not known if either of these actions will be taken. Hogg, if sentenced to the penitentiary, will not be a total stranger at the prison institution for he has served part of a term for horse theft in Crook county.
