The following day, when the "Star Spangled Banner" was sung for the first time in an old tavern next the Holiday street theatre, there one named Ferdinand Durang, mounted on a table, sang the soul inspiring strain and words that caught the enthusiasm of the time and the old walls of the tavern echoed and re-echoed with cheer after cheer, which has continued to echo on down to our day and will still echo far into the future, every time the strains of the "Star Spangled Banner" reach the ears of the friends and daughters "O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave"
