HAMMERLESS GUN KILLS

BARBERMAN KILLED BY PREMATURE DISCHARGE.

Shotgun Strapped to Bicycle, Kills a Member of the Party.

Stanley White, a carriage builder, employed by the Oregon Lumber company, is dead as the result of an accidental gunshot wound received Sunday at 1 o'clock while he was hunting with Jack Geddes out on Virtue flat,

relates the Baker Herald.

Six hours passed before White received medical attention and the unfortunate man, the left side of whose body was frightfully torn by the charge of shot he received, died at about 11:30 o'clock while upon the operating table at St. Elizabeth's hospital.

The accident occurred about two miles west of the Virtue mine. White and Geddes were riding their bicycles through the sagebrush when in some accidental manner Geddes' hammerless gun which was strapped to his wheel was discharged. White was but eight feet from the muzzle of the gun and received the shot in the left side of the abdomen.

Geddes summoned help from the Virtue mine to which place White was

taken on a litter. Dr. Barton was summoned from Baker but was unable to locate the wounded man after he reached the mine and returned to Baker. The doctor was not seen by Geddes and his companions until he had turned about to come back to Baker when their shoutings could not be heard by him.

Later Dr. Dean was summoned and dressed the wound sufficiently to bring the injured man to town in the Bettner ambulance. He was taken to the hospital where he died after a short time.

A Former Cove Resident.

White was aged about 25 years and leaves a wife, but no children. He came to Baker some time ago from Cove where his mother resides. The funeral arrangements will be announced later.

The shooting was so unquestionably accidental in its character that Coroner West decided no investigation was necessary.

JURY RELEASES CASEY

HILGARD LUMBERMAN ACCUSED OF VIOLATING SAWDUST LAW

Fellow Townsman Accused Him of Placing Sawdust in Five Points.

J. D. Casey, prominent sawmill owner and merchant of Hilgard, was acquitted in justice court yesterday afternoon by a jury hearing evidence against Mr. Casey in a case in which C. P. Oral was the complaining witness charging that Mr. Casey had deposited sawdust in Five Points. This stream is a tributary of the Grande Ronde, emptying into the receiving stream just above Hilgard.

Mr. Oral charged that Mr. Casey had deposited sawdust in the stream which is contrary to law. It was a jury trial, heard before Magistrate Arthur Williams.

The jurors were Charles Clements, S. F. Andrews, Harry U. Meyers, William Wynn, H. P. Lewis and Samuel Cochran.
