## OREGON DEVELOPMENT CONGRESS OPENS NEXT MONDAY MORNING

Portland, Ore., Aug. 8.—(Special)—Astoria will give a warm welcome to the delegates of the Oregon Development League convention which meets in the city by the sea August 14, 15 and 16. Coming as it does when the Astoria Centennial celebration is in progress, there will be many interesting events to attract attention from the leaguers.

Matters of great importance to Oregon communities will come before the convention. Addresses scheduled will deal with publicity problems in a helpful way, calculated to solve questions that vex the average development worker; ideas will be exchanged on methods and those attending will come away better informed on matters of the greatest moment to the state.

During the three day session there will be enough entertainment to avoid the tedium that might follow uninterrupted business. A big banquet will be given by the Astoria people and the various point of interest about Astoria will be viewed. Then, too, the historic importance of the Centennial will be appreciated when the pageants and scenes depicting the first century of Oregon history are viewed.
